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Saturday night will be family night with a potluck supper followed by singing and an inspirational service. Visitors are always welcome.

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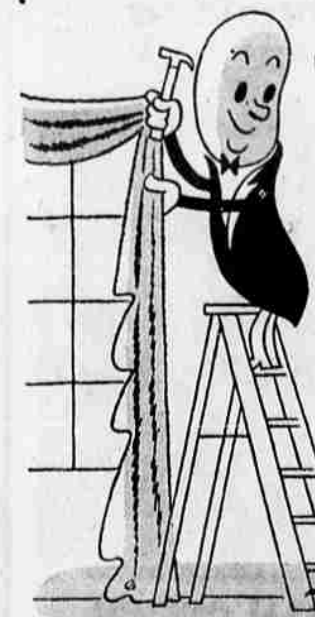

Redwood Firms Grant Pay Boost

EUREKA, Calif., May 9 (AP) — Eight redwood lumber companies of Humboldt and Mendocino counties, involved in one of the country's longest major strikes, announced last night wage increases for 2250 non-union workers who have been keeping the mills in operation despite AFL lines.

AFL lumber and sawmill workers have been out since January 14, 1946. A single mill, the Hammond Lumber company, has since signed an AFL contract.

Operators of the eight firms announcing the new seven and a half cents an hour wage boost said the increase was three cents an hour higher than specified in the Hammond contract, and followed a pattern set by the Douglas fir region of the Northwest.

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
