Chemawa Indian School May Close

SALEM, May 9 (AP)—Superintendent M. W. Evans of the Chemawa Indian school said today he had received orders to close the school May 24 unless congress votes last-minute funds for continuance.
He said the Indian commissioner's office in Chicago had sent the orders because of Indian bureau budget cuts voted by the house and now before the senate.
Evans said the school requires \$250,000 annually. It has 440 students and a staff of 70.

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Spanish End Crippling Steel Tie-Up

BILBAO, Spain, May 9 (AP)—Generalissimo Francisco Franco's government appeared today to have crushed a general strike which virtually immobilized the vital steel industry in this area for eight days—the strongest demonstration by Spanish industrial workers since the civil war.

Most workers returned to their jobs yesterday, penalized by loss of seniority and wage reductions. Informants calculated that 30,000 of an estimated 45,000 workers in steel, heavy machinery, shipbuilding, mines and construction workers stayed away from their jobs Monday and Tuesday. They attributed the collapse of the demonstration to failure of industrial workers in other sections of the country to back it up with sympathy walkouts.

The civil government declared, however, that the strike reached its peak Wednesday, and placed the number idle that day at 11,000. In Madrid, underground Basque sources distributed a manifesto signed by socialist, anarcho-syndicalist and Basque nationalist labor organizations urging the Bilbao strikers to continue "without vacillation."

Queen Sees Basin Area

Following her arrival Wednesday afternoon, Queen for a Day Guy Williamson awoke this morning prepared for her royal trip through the sky to view her domain, the Klamath basin.

Following her Thursday morning inspection of her domain-for-three-days, Queen Guy returned to town yesterday to appear as the honored guest at the weekly Kiwanis luncheon in the Willard hotel.

Later in the afternoon, her highness departed by plane for the farming area around Merrill to sit on a potato planter at one of the large ranches of the region and help plant "Queen for a Day" tubers in the rich soil of the Klamath basin. All reports indicate that she worked like a member of the royal family of Spudland should.

By evening Her Highness was ready for a royal dinner as a guest at the Chet Barton ranch, and after her return from farming she appeared at the local grappling matches, where she was introduced to the assemblage by Ringmaster Jack Franey.

This morning Queen Guy departed by automobile for Klamath agency where she was introduced to various members of the Klamath Indian tribe and shown relics of the aboriginal era in the Klamath basin. This afternoon she is skiing down the long ski runways at Crater Lake national park and this evening she will be honored guest at Lakeshore inn for dinner and dancing.
