## S. 6th Improvement Group To Talk Lights At Meeting

Illumination needs of S. 6th street and an outline for an extensive expansion program for this rapidly expanding business district will be up for discussion at a meeting next Monday night, May 12, called by George Conner, president of the S. 6th Street Improvement association. Anyone interested in the development of this part of the city is invited to be present. The meeting will be called in the office of the Conner Service company, 2007 S. 6th at 8 p. m.

With the first major improvement project, widening and surfacing of the street nearly completed, adequate lighting for the protection of the public is an immediate problem.

Alternate proposals for lighting the street can be adopted. They are organization of an independent lighting district, made possible by recent state legislative action permitting organization of a self-supporting district outside corporate city limits or assumption by the city of the responsibility for cost of installation, maintenance and collections.

Boundaries of the newly formed district if this plan is favored will not be elastic and neighboring areas which at some later date may need a similar lighting program will find it necessary to organize independently.
