

Playground To Be Talked At Meeting

Development of a playground for children of the Buena Vista district will be thoroughly discussed at a meeting scheduled for tonight, Thursday, at 7:30 o'clock at the Klamath Lumber and Box company boarding house, Sam Smith, city recreation director, will meet with interested parents to discuss the summer program.

A group of enthusiastic fathers and mothers gathered last Friday to talk over the installation of a playground for which the community feels a definite need. The property under discussion is owned by Klamath Lumber and Box and use of the land for a playground was granted by officials of the firm. City Engineer E. A. Thomas has agreed to level the land when he receives a written notice from E. Getz of the lumber company. Parents advise there are some 80 children to be benefited by playground facilities and parents told the city council Monday night it would be "worth time and effort and money" to arrange for a place for the children to play during vacation period.

Lumbermen Decline To Bid

PORTLAND, May 15 (AP)—Lumbermen declined to bid on 21 of 46 Oregon-California timber tracts offered for bids in the latest sale, the federal land management agency reported today.

The agency said the offers for 25 tracts sold yesterday totaled \$3,214,355, only 12 per cent above the appraised value of the 40,910,000 feet of timber.

Single bids were offered on 23 tracts and two attracted seven bids. Tracts sold are in Benton, Coos, Douglas, Jackson, Lane, Lincoln, Linn, Marion, Polk and Tillamook counties.

Successful bidders include: North Umpqua Timber company, Roseburg; Northwest Fabricators, Inc., Albany; T. G. Freres Lumber company, Stayton; Theodore G. Meyers and Sons, Oakland, Ore.; Vew Creek Logging company, Corvallis; Western Veneer company, Sweet Home.

Two Children Die In Roaring Flames

LEWISTON, Ida., May 15 (AP)—Two children suffocated early today when fire of unknown origin swept through the family home of Mr. and Mrs. George Stocker.

The victims were Larry, 8, and his sister, George Anne, 7. Firemen with pulmotors worked over the children for nearly an hour without success. The father and another daughter, Linda, 6, were taken to St. Joseph's hospital with serious burns.

Three other children, Cathie, 4, Ronnie 3, and Ralphie, 10 months, and the mother, were uninjured.

Jap Privates Get Hard Labor Jolt

YOKOHAMA, May 15 (AP)—Five former Japanese privates were sentenced to 15 months at hard labor by an 8th army tribunal today for using the decapitated body of an American pilot for bayonet practice.

The five pleaded guilty. The pilot was Lt. Darwin R. Emory, Denver. The Japanese lieutenant who ordered the bayoneting was hanged September 6. Emory's Superfortress was shot down near Tokyo May 25, 1945.

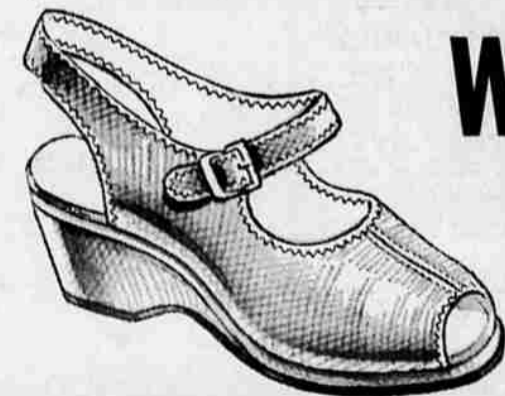

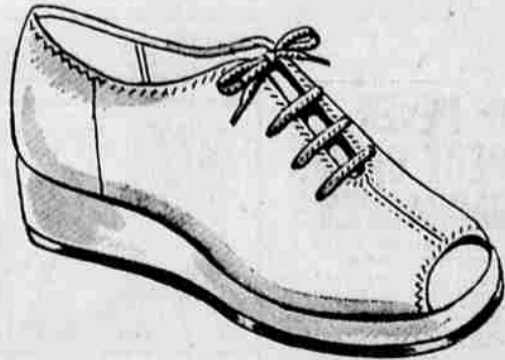
