USGA Won't Feud With St. Andrews

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland, May 15 (AP)—Charles Littlefield, president of the United States Golf Association, says his organization has no feud with the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews.

Speaking to the British Golf Writers association last night, Littlefield said he and Vice President Francis Ouimet had had discussions with the R. and A. over the new rules of golf brought out by the USGA March 1. These rules had been misinterpreted by British newspapers as being a challenge to R. and A.'s reputation as being the ruling house of the golf world.

ALLEN ARRIVES

PORTLAND, May 15 (AP)—Maj. Gen. ("Terrible Terry") Allen arrived here today to present divisional flags to the 104th Infantry division which he commanded on its sweep through Germany.

Road Bids Opened Today

PORTLAND, May 15 (AP)—Construction bids on 10 projects were to be opened today by the state highway commission.

The commission at yesterday's session reinstated the pre-war rule prohibiting logging trucks from operating on state highways Saturday afternoons and Sunday.

The commission appointed Merle R. Chessman, Astoria, to the advisory committee on travel matters, rescinded the 35-miles-an-hour speed limit on highway 99-west through the Camp Adair reservation area, indicated it would approve the Albina Engine and Machine Works bid of \$58,323 for building a new ferry boat.

Plans to link the new Columbia River highway route to downtown Portland via a freeway feeding through Sullivan's gulch were authorized after the commission heard a report work would not begin for several years.

R. H. Baldock, state highway engineer, said the gulch route would be 5,000,000 less than any other route. He estimated total cost at \$7,000,000.

Smaller Cherry Crop In Prospect

PORTLAND, May 15 (AP)—A smaller sweet cherry crop than last year was predicted for Oregon today by the U. S. department of agriculture.

The crop reporting service said the Milton-Freewater district might yield only two-thirds of last year's crop. A smaller harvest was also forecast for The Dalles, due to cold and rain during the flowering period.

The Hood River valley crop, however, was described as better than other districts and may be as large as last season's.

DISAPPOINTED

PORTLAND, May 15 (AP)—Persons seeking employment at the site of McNary dam project will be disappointed, the state employment service reported today in an effort to halt the stream of workers into Umatilla.

The agency said the only work actually at the dam site is the \$743,485 preliminary contract awarded Guy F. Atkinson company.
