

Britain Asks More Grain For Germany

LONDON, May 15 (AP)—British government sources said today that Great Britain had urged the United States to speed grain shipments to Germany "if food riots and even more serious troubles are to be avoided."

Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin in his advisers discussed what was called the "gloomy and difficult outlook" for two hours. The full cabinet government was expected to tackle the problem tomorrow.

No Diversion
A foreign office spokesman said Britain was not considering diverting grain supplies destined for the United Kingdom to Germany to relieve the shortage.

Winston Churchill appealed tonight for universal support for a United States of Europe and assured Russia such a union would not be a "sinister plot against the Soviet."

He urged Britain and France to be "founder partners" in the movement.

The wartime prime minister said Britain and France also must take the lead in restoring the German national economy before the Germans "turn their thoughts to revolt and revenge." He spoke before a "United Europe" meeting in London's Royal Albert hall.

Churchill's appeal came at a time when world attention was focused on the food crisis and discontent among the German people.

He called Europe a "rubble heap, a charnel house, a breeding ground of pestilence and hate."

Jews Moving Over Brenner Pass
BRENNER PASS, Italy, May 15 (AP)—Jews of Central Europe are moving secretly once more without passing across the Alpine frontier between Austria and Italy, hoping to find ports from which to sail for Palestine.

The arrival of 72 of them, all without identification or permits, in the French zone of Austria, heralded last week the large scale resumption of their migration, stalled during the winter by low temperatures and deep snow in the Alpine passes.

New Food Casing Found
WASHINGTON, May 15 (AP)—A new material made from citrus peel or apple pomace (pulp) has been developed by agriculture department scientists for use as casings for sausage or other food products.

The food product, molded into any desired shape, is dipped in the solution for about three seconds. The coating dries in about half an hour. The coating dissolves when the enclosed product is boiled. If fried or roasted, the film may be consumed with its contents, since it is tender and edible.

The department said the new coating material may be used also for fruits and vegetables.

Pre-Nursing Course Urged
SEATTLE, May 15 (AP)—Pre-nursing courses in public high schools was advocated today by John H. Hayes of Chicago, president of the American Hospital association, as a long range aid in alleviating the shortage of registered nurses.
