

Fisher Tells Modoc War History

History of the Modoc war was reviewed Sunday by Don C. Fisher, custodian of the Lava Beds national monument, in a guided tour of the country for a caravan of 32 cars and 120 people.

The caravan was made up of members of Siskiyou and Klamath County Historical societies, with over three quarters of the cars coming from Yreka and thereabouts.

The town of Stronghold was the meeting place and the first stop was the marker beside the SP railroad for two unknown soldiers. The soldiers were Warm Springs scouts killed in the battle of Dry lake in 1873, whose bodies were found when the railroad was built. The marker is located just opposite the Newell Jap camp.

An old Indian camp site, below the present Easter cross, was the next stop. Here 17 mortar pits, gouged out of the rocks, and petroglyphs on the cliffs were examined. Petroglyphs, old Indian symbols carved on the cliffs, were examined next and then the caravan proceeded to Captain Jack's Stronghold. A hike of about one mile among the rocky natural fortress of the stronghold wound up the tour until lunch, which was eaten picnic style just inside the main entrance of the monument.

J. P. Russell of Yreka, 90 years old and eldest member of the caravan, said of removing bodies of soldiers who died in battle in the area, to the cemetery at the San Francisco Presidio in about 1888. The youngest member of the group was two-year-old Bill Robinson, also with the party from Yreka.

After lunch some of the people went on to the lava caves and others left for their homes.

Vet Address Important

Ex-GI's who want faster service from the veterans administration were reminded today that they should keep the VA informed of their changes of address.

Some veterans have sent changes of address notices to expedite their subsistence and compensation checks but have neglected to notify the insurance service which handles their GI policies, Patrick W. Kilby, VA representative here, explained.

Because separate files are maintained for these benefits, veterans are requested to send changes of address to both offices.

Checks are mailed for subsistence payments and compensation from the VA regional office at Portland. Veterans should send changes of address on insurance matters to the Veterans Administration, Exchange Building, Seattle 4, Wash.

Falls. Present plans call for an annual show based along these lines, the art director advised.

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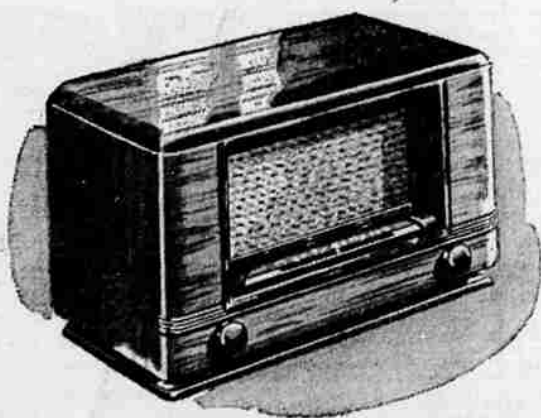

Stephens Tells USBR History

History of the early days of the bureau of reclamation in the Klamath country was told by E. L. Stephens, superintendent of the bureau, to an audience of reclamation employees and their families at a meeting Friday night.

Supplementing Stephens' lecture were slides of scenes of the early 1800s and the building of the government's irrigation canals through

the basin area. They were shown by Joe LaClain, director of audio-visual education in the city schools.

Refreshments were served following the session. Additional meetings featuring instructive information on the work of reclamation are planned for the future.

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
