## Judge Takes Own Life

PENDLETON, Ore., May 21 (AP)—Judge C. L. Sweek, Umatilla-Morrow county district circuit judge 16 years, died at his home late Monday of a self-inflicted gunshot wound, his son Jack reported today.

Judge Sweek, one of the best known men in Eastern Oregon, was 61 and had suffered with cancer for some time, his illness had been described as incurable.

He died a short time after shooting himself in the head with a small caliber revolver, the son said.

Sweek was born March 3, 1886, at Hamilton, Ore. He attended Oregon State college, the University of Oregon and graduated from the University of Michigan law school in 1913. He practiced law at Heppner from 1915 to 1931, coming here when elected to the circuit bench.

## Bigger Labor Board Talked

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—Senator Taft (R-Ohio) said today that conferees ironing out differences between the house and senate labor bills have agreed tentatively on enlarging the national labor relations board to seven members. There are three members at present.

A provision for a large board is in the senate bill. The house measure would replace the NLRB with a new labor-management relations board.

Taft announced the tentative decision to set aside the house section after another two-and-a-half hour session of the conference committee, the third thus far. The committee, composed of senators and house members, was appointed to compromise differences after house and senate passed differing labor legislation.

## Indians Get Per Capita Pay

The Klamath Agency office is in the midst of spring per capita payments with 1563 per capita shares of \$125 each being issued to members of the Klamath tribe on the reservation. Total payment this spring will reach \$195,375, according to Supt. B. G. Courtright.

Usual per capita payment, made twice yearly, is \$200 but due to a delay in the United States treasury department the payment this spring was only \$125, Courtright said. The difference will be made up in the fall per capita payment, Courtright asserted. The superintendent observed that the tribe had sold just as much Indian timber as in past years and payments should be as large as usual.

## Solons Ask End To Sugar Ration

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—Senators McCarthy (R-Wis.) and Brickner (R-Ohio) Tuesday introduced legislation to end sugar rationing immediately.

"I am confident congress will pass this," McCarthy told reporters. "There is already such a surplus of sugar that it is now backing up in warehouses."

Under present law, sugar rationing is slated to end October 31.

In a separate move, Senator Dworshak (R-Idaho) asked Secretary of Agriculture Anderson today to lift sugar rationing to housewives immediately.

## Cultural Program OK'd

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—The house foreign affairs subcommittee today approved legislation to establish an "office of information and educational exchange" in the state department.

Under terms of the bill, the office—with several restrictions—would be directed to carry on an informational program. Funds for the program were eliminated last week by the house on the ground there now exists no specific authorization for its operation.

The subcommittee acted after hearing Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower express conviction that all the nations of the world "can live together peacefully if we use a little sense" and cultivate common understanding. He urged approval of the legislation.

Chairman Mundt (R-S.D.) said the full committee will meet to consider the measure tomorrow. He ex-
