

OSC Faculty Members To Be Retired

CORVALLIS, May 21 (AP)—Forty-four Oregon State college faculty members—many of them widely known throughout the state—will be retired July 1 under the new state program requiring it for those reaching age 65.

Dr. U. G. Dubach, dean of men, among the group, will move to the Lewis and Clark college faculty at Portland.

Four-H clubs will lose two leaders—Harry Seymour and Helen J. Cowgill. Others in the agricultural service slated for retirement are F. C. Reimer, superintendent of the Southern Oregon branch experiment station; R. G. Fowler, Jackson county agent, and George A. Nelson, Columbia county agent.

E. B. Beaty, professor of mathematics and head of the Oregon Masonic order; H. L. Beard, assistant professor of mathematics and for 45 years leader of the OSC band; Dr. F. A. Magruder, professor of political science and author of many books on government; Dr. W. H. Mason, professor of economics and tax authority; M. Clyde Phillips, professor of mechanical engineering, just completing 50 years on the staff; Paul Petri, head of the department of music; Mrs. Petri, professor of music; and Dr. Carl W. Balzer, assistant dean of education, are among those retiring.
