

# Youth Talk Heard At Knife, Fork

The school's function in character building is more important now than ever before. It was emphasized by Mrs. Paul Whitney, noted authority on youth problems, in a talk to the Klamath Falls Knife and Fork club at the Willard last night.

While recognizing the great value of the church and the home, Mrs. Whitney said that changing conditions had brought the character building problem more directly into the school situation. The church can and must do a job for youth, she said, but not all children are in church. Labor saving devices and other changing conditions have taken parents more and more out of the home, and where the home fails the school must achieve.

Attention Urged  
She urged more attention to the individual child in the school, and suggested youth counseling programs and smaller classes for each teacher. She emphasized the importance of providing schools with simple funds, but said that the financial issue is not the only question—teachers themselves must have character to develop it among youngsters.

Mrs. Whitney said that the school's opportunity is great because all children must be there. Truancy, she said, always precedes delinquency, and that gives school authorities an opportunity to determine ahead of time the presence of a delinquency trend.

The speaker said that youth delinquency is blamed too often on the war, and indicated that conditions would be about the same if there had been no war. She urged a spiritual regeneration, and more attention to home environment. The broken home factor in delinquency was emphasized, and she reminded that no nation rises above the level of its homes. She urged Arnold Gralapp, superintendent of schools, introduced Mrs. Whitney.

# Ambassador Dies Today

BRYAN, Tex., May 22 (AP)—William S. Howell, 54, business man, attorney and veteran of the U. S. diplomatic service, died today, one-half hour before he was to leave for South America to assume his new post as U. S. ambassador to Uruguay.

Shortly before 5:30 a. m. his step-mother, Mrs. W. S. Howell, called to awaken the recently appointed ambassador. Receiving no answer, she went to his bedroom and found him unconscious and dying.

Dr. A. G. McGill of Bryan said Howell died of a heart attack.

Howell's death recalled the fatal heart attack suffered February 6 by O. Max Gardner, 64, in New York, eight hours before he was to sail for England as U. S. ambassador to the Court of St. James.

# Seaside Votes Out Auditorium Move

SEASIDE, May 22 (AP)—Seaside isn't going to have a municipal auditorium in the middle of the street. It isn't going to have one anywhere else, either.

Construction of an auditorium which upset the town when an error in election petitions placed its site in mid-street—was voted down by a 150 margin.

But the mistake wasn't responsible. The city had earlier ruled that the auditorium, if approved in the election, could be built in the proper place.

# Harry Signs Greco Aid Bill Today

KANSAS CITY, May 22 (AP)—President Truman today signed the \$400,000,000 Greek-Turkish aid bill setting in force a historic American foreign policy of bolstering weak countries against outside aggression as a "support" to the United Nations.

He called it "an important step in the building of peace" and said it offered "proof" that the United States will make "a vigorous effort to help create conditions of peace."

"The conditions of peace," he said, "include the ability of nations to maintain order and independence and to support themselves economically."

Truman faced worried after anxious days at his

mother's sickbed read his statement to a group of reporters.

Looking up from the text he departed from it once to reiterate that the bill "is a step for peace and support of the United Nations."

"I can not emphasize that too strongly."

He also signed immediately an executive order transferring certain administrative authority to the secretary of state.

Ross said that the appointment of an administrator of the program was "being worked on in Washington today."

**Mary Lee Taylor's Fruit Icebox Cake**  
Broadcast: May 24, 1947

1/2 cup Fat Milk  
2 teaspoons unflavored gelatin  
3 tablespoons cold water  
1 1/2 cups sliced, fresh strawberries  
1/4 cup sugar

1/4 cup white cream cheese (2 oz.)  
1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice  
few grains salt  
8 strips plain cake, 1 1/2 inches

Chill milk until icy cold. Soften gelatin in cold water. Mix strawberries with sugar. Blend cheese, lemon juice and salt together. Dissolve gelatin over boiling water; stir into cheese mixture. Add berries. Chill until syrupy. Line an oiled 1 1/2-pint mold with cake strips. Whip chilled milk until stiff. Fold into chilled gelatin mixture. Put into mold. Chill until firm. Unmold. Garnish with whole strawberries if desired. Makes 4 servings.

\*To use frozen, sweetened strawberries, omit sugar. Thaw berries; add to cheese mixture without draining. Cut-up, canned peaches, pineapple or fruit cocktail can replace strawberries if you use 1 cup fruit and 1/2 cup juice.

\*\*Pound, sponge, angel cake or lady fingers can be used.
