

Coed Goes On Trial For Murder

SANTA ANA, Calif., May 26 (AP)—Heiress Louise Overell and her husky fiancé, George Gollum, went on trial today on murder charges stemming from the death of her wealthy, socialite parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter E. Overell, aboard their dynamite-blasted yacht March 15.

Calvin the 18-year-old pre-medical student sweetheart declared their innocence as they spent a pre-trial Sunday in the county jail, she knitting and chatting and he playing checkers with a cellmate.

Sole Heir
Miss Overell, who attended the University of Southern California, became the sole heir to the \$600,000 estate of the Overells, who lived in a Mediterranean-style villa in Flintridge, near Los Angeles. She and Gollum, a Los Angeles City college student, disclosed a fierce love for each other in letters exchanged in jail, copies of which were published after the prosecution had secretly photographed them.

The sweethearts said they had planned to be married on Louise's 18th birthday, April 30, and for a time declared they would be married in jail but they were not.

Miss Overell, because she was only 17, a minor when the killings occurred and therefore could not be subject to the death penalty, could have been released on \$50,000 bail but she and her attorneys elected to have her remain in jail for defense consultations.

Standard To Give Photos

The 1947 edition of Standard of California's famous "Scenic View" travel promotion program will get under way today, when the oil company and its subsidiaries begin free distribution of 27,000,000 full-color "See Your West" photographs.

This year a total of 50 views of top tourist attractions in 15 western states, British Columbia, Hawaii and Alaska will be given away at the companies' retail outlets.

The photographs are 9 by 12 inches and are printed on 15 by 15 inch mats. On the back of each mat is a commentary on the scene written by a well-known author.

The scenes were chosen from more than 6000 natural color photographs submitted by professional and amateur cameramen all over the country.

Distribution will be made on a regional basis, with 15 different views available in each of seven areas in the West. By traveling into the other distributing areas or by correspondence with other collectors in these areas, the public can obtain the entire set of 34 pictures.

Within each area the 15 views offered will be distributed in weekly rotation in a number of different zones. Thus, if pictures are missed at one point, or if duplicates are wanted, they can be picked up in an adjoining zone.

TB Convention In Portland
"Team Work and Planning for Cooperative Programs," will be the theme of the joint meeting of the Oregon and Washington Tuberculosis associations, to be held June 3 and 4 at the Multnomah hotel in Portland.

On Wednesday, June 4, the morning session will be devoted to a symposium on medical research in tuberculosis. The latest reports on streptomycin and RCG and new methods for treatment of tuberculosis will be heard at this session.

A symposium on "Cooperative Participation in the Tuberculosis Control Program" will be held on June 3, with speakers representing departments of county health, state health, TB hospital, private physician, public health nurses, voluntary tuberculosis association and the department of education.

The National Tuberculosis Association will hold a meeting in San Francisco, June 16 to 20, at the Fairmont hotel. A large delegation is expected to attend from Oregon.

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No Fires Burning In Oregon Now

SALEM, May 26 (AP)—The state forestry department said today there are no fires burning in the state, but it described slash areas, open hillsides and exposed areas as a "powder keg."

It said, however, that green timber still is damp enough to prevent fires from running.

Wendell Ewing, forestry department dispatcher, said the outlook for slight improvement this week, but that things wouldn't improve enough to help much. The weather bureau advised him today of the danger of lightning storms in the mountains and eastern Oregon, with prospects that fires may be started.

Beginning Wednesday, the weather should become cloudy. With humidity of 30 considered the danger point below which logging operations must stop, Ewing said the humidity would be around that point throughout the week over most of the state.

The humidity in eastern Oregon is between 20 and 25. It is 25 in the Rogue river area, between 30 and 35 over the rest of the area between the Cascade and Coast ranges.

The only bright spot is along the coast, where fog has brought the humidity up to 50.

SALEM, May 26 (AP)—Oregon's retail sales tax, should it become effective, will not apply to the distribution or newstand sales of newspapers. Attorney General George Neuner ruled Saturday, in clarifying the wording of legislation as requested by the state tax commission.

Labor Party Backs Training

MARGATE, Eng., May 26 (AP)—The labor party voted by a ratio of 2332 to 571 today in favor of peace-time conscription to back up the nation's foreign policy.

The vote repulsed "rebel" elements who argued this policy was too closely aligned with that of the United States and too antagonistic to Russia.

A draft bill for 12-month conscription has passed the house of commons.

With Prime Minister Clement Attlee and nearly all of his cabinet attending, the party conference defeated by a show of hands a motion to permit laborites to join the British-Soviet society. Opponents of the resolution said the society was dominated by communists.

Opponents of the house of lords submitted a resolution calling for the creation of an elected upper house to replace the house of lords as now constituted. The peers would be permitted to retain their hereditary titles, but no new hereditary titles would be created.

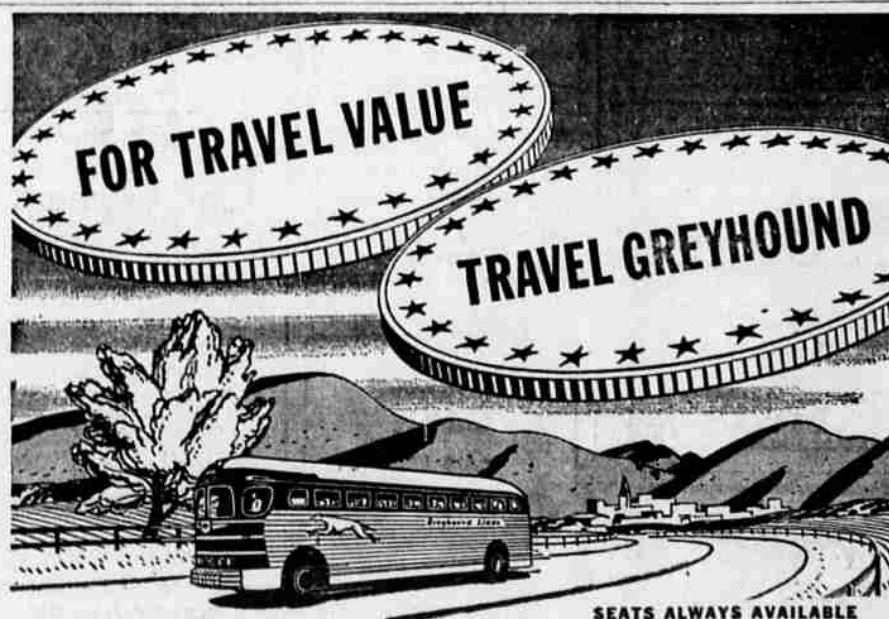
The resolution sought to prevent the predominantly conservative lords from stalling or blocking socialist legislation.

Mrs. Frank Pepple and Hazel Morrison of Klamath Falls spent Wednesday in Bonanza and attended the graduation in the evening.

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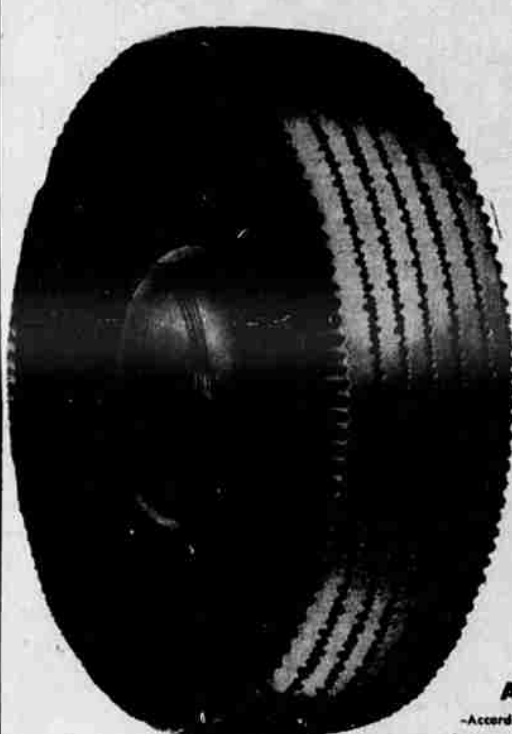
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
