

Odell Lake Searched For Missing Pair

China and India during the recent war.

Callier is a veteran of nearly 20 years in the navy and holds the rank of chief petty officer. His wife, Marcella, operates a restaurant at Modoc Point.

The Odell lake tragedy is the first of the fishing season in Klamath county, and the first in recent years on Odell, which is considered one of the more dangerous of the mountain lakes. A similar occurrence took place on nearby Crescent lake two years ago when two marines disappeared from a small boat. Their bodies were never recovered.

Mr. and Mrs. Lowell J. Hadley of Vale, parents of Harold Hadley, arrived here yesterday to be with their daughter-in-law, Mrs. Hadley's mother, Mrs. S. W. Mann of Portland, and her brother, W. S. Mann of Centralia, Wash., are also here. Arriving by plane today is Mrs. J. DePasquale of Baltimore, Md., Mrs. Hadley's sister.

Callier has been in Klamath Falls about two years. He was due to retire from the navy in August, with 20 years in. A native of Tacoma, he joined the navy when he was 18. During the last war he was on a submarine and was decorated for heroism in action.

He and his wife were married in Honolulu in 1935. Two brothers, Arthur and Leo, arrived from Tacoma today.

Plans are being made for dragging the lake and an air search with an amphibian plane tomorrow if the weather permits.

William Owsley and William McCauley, friends of Harold Hadley, left at 4 a. m. today to aid in the search. Owsley, an accountant here, worked with Hadley for some time in the office of internal revenue.

Building OK Denied

Notification was received yesterday that the construction review committee of CPA at Portland had turned down an application from Harley H. Franklin, 4144 Summers lane, for permission to construct a \$7000 service station here.

Franklin already has the building nearly completed, according to Richfield Oil company officials, and is ready to start operations June 7. The Richfield people stated that they didn't know what the situation was under the disapproval.

The station is being built on Summers lane across from Highway 10.

City Building Inspector Walter Salsbery stated today that he didn't think the civilian production administration had the power to take any action other than demand discontinuation of further construction on the building.

Franklin was not available for comment this morning.

Police Check Two Thefts

Two burglaries last night which police said were strikingly similar in style netted the thieves something over \$300 in cash, 10 automobile tires and a good haul of other miscellaneous equipment.

The first, in point of time, apparently took place at the Bill Davis Associated Oil station, 2101 S. 6th, where between \$35 and \$40 in silver was taken from the till.

Also taken from the station were an adding machine, 10 new tires, several items of auto accessories such as power lights, bumper jacks, heavy jacks and locking gas caps.

The other robbery was at W. D. Miller Construction company office, also on S. 6th, where the loot was about \$275 in currency and checks. The office safe, which had been left open, was ransacked and a cash box punched open.

In both instances, according to police report, entry was made by breaking out front door glass.

Oregon Leading Lumber Market

WASHINGTON, May 26 (AP)—Oregon still leads the nation in lumber production, the forest service says. Lyle F. Watts, chief of the service, told a house appropriations subcommittee that in 1946 the state cut 5,550,165,000 board feet—11 per cent more than in 1945.

Washington state's output was 3,121,602,000 board feet in 1946 or 4 per cent less than in 1945, Watts said in testimony made public today.

The explosion was muffled by the soundproof room. Utilizing a "dolly" several steel compartments of the safe were taken to a nearby vacant lot and the contents totaling \$1000 removed. Police said it was one of the slickest jobs they had ever seen.

LEEDS, England, May 26 (AP)—The Earl of Harewood, brother-in-law of King George VI, and one of the wealthiest men in England, died at his ancestral home here Saturday of cardiac complications and asthma.

The earl, who married the princess royal in 1922, became ill several days ago after a severe chill. He was 64 years old.

The earl died at Harewood house, his ancestral home in Leeds. The princess royal and members of his family were with him at the end.

News of the death was sent to King George, at the royal lodge at Windsor, where he is spending the Whitsun holiday.

A. Mahoney. He is at liberty under \$1000 bail.

Fishing Trip Comes High

These boys really paid for a fishing trip! State police officers, returning here from Lakeview, reported the arrest Friday of Donald Eugene Wilson and Robert Nelson LaPlant, both of Lakeview, when they were picked up angling in a closed stream, to-wit: Willow creek.

First of all, officers found the two in possession of 53 fish, illegal amount on a closed stream. They later visited LaPlant's home and found deer meat. LaPlant was fined a total of \$268, charges ranging from illegal possession of deer meat, no angling license, exceeding the possession limit, trout under six inches and angling in a closed stream. Wilson was fined \$163.50 on the last four counts. Officers said their car was covered with fir boughs and tracks brushed out by the boughs. The two were in the Lake county jail.

Explosion Victim Loses Battle

TACOMA, May 26 (AP)—Eldon Clark, 25 year old victim of an explosion, lost his 100 to 1 battle against death at Madigan General hospital early Saturday.

The victim, whose body was 65 per cent burned in an explosion on his Littlebrook farm, submitted to a skin grafting operation Friday. His four brothers and seven fellow employees at a Olympia plant donated skin and four doctors worked in relays in a herculean effort to save his life.

He talked with attendants after the operation, but gradually failed during the night.

Snake River Run To Be Tried

PORTLAND, Ore., May 26 (AP)—A party headed by Portland river men will attempt to run the Snake river from Lewiston south to Granite falls, a distance of 105 miles, this week-end.

The party left here to board the 50-foot steel-hulled towboat Chief Joseph at Lewiston. The group was headed by Lew S. Russell, manager of a barge line. Some of the party took the same boat upriver within 10 miles of Granite falls two years ago.

Blaze Destroys Old Building

What was supposed by Frank Poole, county fire warden, to be a man-caused fire, destroyed an old building on the Old Port road about 2:30 a. m. Sunday.

The building, located about one and one-half miles from Klamath Falls, where the Colman Dairy lane turns off the Marine Barracks road, was an old dwelling which had not been occupied for about six years and belonged to Mrs. Clara Colman.

Value of the destroyed building was estimated by Poole at around \$750.
