

16-Year-Old Charged With Murder In Flower Patch Slaying Of 4 Companions

IMLAY CITY, Mich., May 27 (AP)—Slender, 16-year-old Oliver Terpenning Jr., was arrested near Toledo, O., today and was charged with murder in the flower-patch slaying of four teen-aged farm neighbors.

Justice Albert Perkins signed a warrant on recommendation of Prosecutor Kenneth Smith of LaPeere county, charging Terpenning with the murder of 16-year-old Barbara Smith, oldest of the four victims and "girl friend" of Terpenning.

The bodies of three girls and a boy, bouquets of flowers clutched in their hands, were found late Monday near a swampy gravel pit. They were Barbara, 16, Gladys, 12, Janet, 2, and Stanley, 14, children of Mr. and Mrs. William Smith, living on a farm nine miles northeast of here.

Terpenning was turned over to Ohio authorities shortly after a motorist gave him a ride as he hitchhiked south toward the Michigan-Ohio line.

Police officials in both states said he admitted shooting the children about 3 p. m. Monday but that he gave no reason for his act.

Sgt. Carl Siem of the Michigan state police post at Erie, Mich., said the high school boy appeared to be "inna fog."

The youth, a "boy friend" of the

slain Barbara Smith, had been the object of a statewide hunt since another of Smith's 14 children found the bodies.

The four Smith children were found dead of bullet wounds in the backs of their heads. The boy was about 100 feet away from the girls, officers said, as though shot down while fleeing.

Two physicians examined the girls and said there was no evidence of rape.

Another Smith child, 19-year-old Ella Mae, left the supper table to look for the children and ran screaming back a short time later to report her discovery of their bodies.

Wallace Talks In Portland

PORTLAND, Ore., May 27 (AP)—Former Vice President Henry A. Wallace warned of a "century of fear" in a speech here last night and said it would result from the Truman doctrine in foreign policy and "one party coalition" in congress.

Wallace also called for internationalization of the Panama canal, the Dardanelles and the Suez canal as steps vital to eliminate the causes of war. He said the control by one country of these strategic areas "tends to break up peace."

He told an audience of 3000 the nation was heading for a depression, and said a reduction of prices and raising of wages where possible must be accompanied by loans to European and Asiatic nations to raise their standards of living.

He denounced John Tabor, chairman of the house appropriations committee, and said American

Search On For Missing Man

RAYMOND, Wash., May 27 (AP)—Pacific county sheriffs hunted a missing game protector today after a week-end search that marked off one five-month disappearance and brought to light still a third.

The game protector is Morris Henshaw of Long Island, 35 miles west of South Bend, who was last seen Friday when Bob Walker, cyster patrolman, flew over the island in his patrol plane. Walker said Henshaw was taking off some clothing before going out after his boat. The following day only the boat, Henshaw's dog and some raccoons the game protector had taken, were visible, Walker said.

During the search, Deputy Sheriff George Maltman said the party found the body of Dennis Gleason, 34, who drowned last January 24 when lost off a fishing boat.

The new mystery developed Saturday when Harry Bochaw of Bay Center found the thigh and upper limbs of a body at the east end of Rhodessa beach, ten miles west of South Bend. Sunday Vern Say of Raymond found a foot at the beach. Authorities said they had no record of a missing person which would fit such a description.
