

Plans Final For Memorial Day Ceremony; Program To Start At Link River

Memorial Day plans were completed today with Friday's program divided between ceremonies for those at sea at the Link river bridge, at the Link river bridge, and at the Link river bridge, and ending with the placing of wreaths in Linkville cemetery.

Arranged by the Allied Veterans council, the May 30 ceremonies will start at the bridge. All units will assemble at the west side of Link river at 9:15 a.m. Services will be conducted at the bridge by Amvets, assisted by the navy recruiting service staff presenting a regular sea burial ceremony. Units will then parade to the shaft where formal services will be held in memory of those who lost their lives in conflict.

Posse To Join Parade

The Klamath Sheriff's Posse will meet tonight at 7 at the fairgrounds for a final drill prior to taking part in Friday's Memorial Day parade. Members of the posse taking part in the Memorial Day parade are asked to assemble at the fairgrounds at 8 a.m. Friday. Those who cannot make it to the grounds are asked to assemble at the courthouse in full uniform, with taps sounded by the Fraternal Order of Eagles bugle corps.

Wreaths will be placed at the base of the shaft by commanders of all veterans' organizations and by individuals. Formal presentation of wreaths on the "Tomb of the Unknown Soldier," placed on the courthouse lawn in the midst of a field of red poppies, will be made by Forty and Eight.

The program will be broadcast by KFWJ. A loud speaker has been arranged by courtesy of Conner's Radio Service.

All units will then march in parade to Linkville cemetery where graveside ceremonies will be conducted by the Amvets.

The program, slated to start at 10:15 a.m., will open with the invocation by the Rev. Victor Phillips, pastor of the Linkville church. Phil Hitchcock, president of the Klamath County chamber of commerce, and speaker of the day is John Linman of the Elks lodge and chairman of the memorial committee. The benediction will be given by the Rev. D. W. Anderson and the national anthem will be played by the KUMHS band directed by Andrew Loney Jr. The firing squad will be made up of members of the Marine Corps League in full uniform, with taps sounded by the Fraternal Order of Eagles bugle corps.

Veterans of Foreign Wars, Units now entered are Reserve Officers, KUHS band, FOE bugle corps, FOE auxiliary drum corps, FOE drill team, Boy Scout troops, grade school units, veterans' organizations and veteran groups participating include Spanish American War, VFW, American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Amvets and Marine Corps League and the Klamath County Sheriff's Posse.

Parade marshal for the day is Dick Gallagher who will lead the massed colors. E. E. Benner is general chairman of the day, representing the Allied Veterans Council. Business houses, banks, schools, the city hall and courthouse, libraries, stores and the Oregon liquor store will be closed all day Friday as will be mills and construction outfits. Many of the mills will remain closed Saturday, giving employees a three-day holiday. The Herald and News will not publish on Friday, Memorial Day. All members of the Klamath Automobile Dealers association will remain closed Friday and Saturday.
