

Ocean Fish Market Shows Big Drop

ASTORIA, Ore., May 28 (AP)—A downward trend in the ocean fish market was reflected here today. From buyers' price ranges, al-

ready considered too low by fishermen, ling cod dropped 1/2 cent to 4 cents; sablefish 8 to 6; rockfish, 4 to 2 1/2; English sole, 4 to 3; petrale, 6 to 5. The new prices were reported by the U. S. Market Index.

Mr. and Mrs. Card, assisted by their son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. "Chuck" Card, will personally operate the business. The family purchased a home here recently. Charles Card was mayor of Merrill for several years.
