

# Recreation Program Takes Form

Plans are progressing for the city's summer recreation program with a tentative swimming schedule and a partial list of the staff members, according to Samuel H. Smith, city recreation director.

Tentatively appointed to the staff are Joe Peak and Lillian Redkey, swimming instructors, assisted by Charles Blackstone; Ward Friedman, life guard; Harry Moratto, assistant guard; with Barbara Reeder assisting; Robert Banister and A. K. Downs, arts and crafts supervisor; Ed Ryan, play center director; Norma Smith, girls' activities; and Moratto, woodworking.

Directors of the elementary centers are Bob Hendershott, Mills; Patsy Hambrick, Roosevelt; Ted Heeves, Fremont; and Dorothy Regan, Pelican.

Date of the opening of activities is June 16, and on Saturday, June 14, there will be an institute for playground workers in Smith's office at the city hall.

Weekend schedule on the swimming instruction program follows: 9 to 10 a. m.—students over 13 years old.

10 to 11 a. m.—10 to 12-year-old beginners.

11 a. m. to 12 noon—10 to 12-year-old intermediates.

1 to 2 p. m.—7 to 9-year-old beginners.

2 to 3 p. m.—7 to 9-year-old intermediates.

3 to 4 p. m.—13-year-old students and over.

The classes will be held to 50 students in each age group. From 6 to 9 p. m., weekdays, there will be open public swimming with admission charges of 25 cents for children under 12, 50 cents for adults and no children will be admitted unless accompanied by an adult.

There will also be public swimming from 9 a. m. to 12 noon, 2 to 5 p. m., and 6 to 9 p. m., Saturdays, and from 2 to 5 p. m., Sundays.
