They are Ross Leon Seagrave, 23, Roseburg, serving nine months for auto theft; and Wayne Robinson, 21, Medford, serving two years for forgery.

Seagrave would have been eligible for parole next July 17, and Robinson was due for parole next November 3.

Battered Car Found In Water
ASTORIA, Ore., June 5 (AP)—The discovery of a battered car in 32 feet of water at an unused mill dock in Knappton, Wash., was reported today by the coast guard.

Coast guardsmen said the car, empty and with license plates missing, appeared to have driven off the pier into the water about three weeks ago. The dock has been abandoned since the mill burned in 1941.

Quick Action On School Bid Urged

Klamath County chamber of commerce has sent a telegram to the federal public housing authority in Washington, D. C., urging quick action on approval of the conversion program at the Oregon Vocational school plant east of town.

The chamber action was ordered by the board of directors after it was learned that the bid of Pinniger and Watkins of Klamath Falls to do the work had been found satisfactory by the state, but that the job could not start until PHPA gave the green light.

Howard Ferrin, architect in charge, told the chamber board that PHPA delay might mean cancellation of orders for some materials and other difficulties that would materially slow down the job of providing living quarters for students and instructors at the school.

Manager Charles Stark said today he had not had a reply from PHPA. He asked the agency to give its approval before Friday of this week.

The chamber board also went on record as protesting the name given the new educational institution, and instructed Manager Stark to convey its sentiments to members of the state board of education.
