

Search On For Victims Of Sinking

FORT WILLIAM, Ont., June 5 (AP)—Search was renewed today in the cold waters of Lake Superior for an ailing boat of victims who perished when the Canadian freighter Emperor sank early yesterday morning on jutting rocks of Isle Royale.

Twelve crew members were believed drowned, while 21 others who managed to board lifeboats or were rescued from the rocks were rescued by the coast guard cutter Kimball.

Delay Foreseen
Threatening weather forced a delay in the grim hunt for victims yesterday afternoon after the bodies of two women—Mrs. Joseph Tobachuk, 30, of Fort William, and Mrs. Edna Schultz of Owen Sound, Ont.—had been taken from the water.

The Canada Steamship Lines, owner of the ill-fated ship that was carrying iron ore to the lower lakes, announced Northern Engineering company's vessel, Coastal Queen, had been commissioned to renew the search for another woman and nine men.

Although there was practically no hope that any of the missing crew could be alive after long exposure on the northern lake, the Coastal Queen carried three small power boats to scour the bleak headlands of Isle Royale, a remote national park.

Oak Ridge Denies Communists

OAK RIDGE, Tenn., June 5 (AP)—The Association of Oak Ridge Engineers and Scientists today challenged Rep. J. Parnell Thomas (R-N.J.) to produce "just one communist within Oak Ridge."

Commenting on charges by the chairman of the house un-American activities committee that "fellow travelers, if not actual members of the communist party," have infiltrated into the atomic bomb plants here, John H. Bull, chairman of the association's executive committee, declared:

"I know of no Oak Ridge communist, never heard of one before, and have never seen one here."

LAKE SUCCESS, June 5 (AP)—The small countries on the United Nations security council today leveled their fire at a Big Five report on organization of a global police force.

Belgium led off the criticism at the opening of general debate yesterday, charging that the major powers were making plans only to stop "certain categories of wars" and offering no provisions to block aggression by a big nation.

Pinball Game Charges Filed

SPOKANE, June 5 (AP)—Seven allegations of malfeasance, misfeasance and nonfeasance of duties were contained in recall charges filed yesterday against Public Safety Commissioner William P. Payne.

The charges were filed by Gordon W. Johnson, chairman of the law enforcement subcommittee of the "Committee of 1939," a group which has been protesting the city's action in rescinding its ban against slot and pinball machines. Johnson said the ban is a private citizen.

The seven counts include an allegation that slot machines and pinball machines have been "openly and notoriously operated in Spokane in violation of the ordinances of said city and the laws of the state of Washington."

Johnson said recall petitions would be circulated.

Cricket Cause Little Damage

PENDLETON, Ore., June 5 (AP)—A few Mormon crickets have invaded Ordinance area wheat and other grain fields but have caused little damage, James Beamer, agriculture conservation secretary, said today.

The crickets, which have been pressing towards Umatilla river valley irrigated crops the past two weeks or more, have been stopped all along the 12-mile front between Boardman and Ordinance by poison bait lines, he said.

The insects that have infiltrated fields bordering the sagebrush desert mostly are scattered "patrols" of the main bands which as yet have failed to breach main bait lines west of Ordinance, Beamer said, and added that many of those that did reach the fields were sick from poison consumed en route and died before they could damage the crops.

Poisoning of the hordes, which had slowed their migration because of egg-laying, continues and will be continued until the insects die in another 10 days or two weeks.

Mexican Railroad Men Call Strike

MEXICO CITY, June 5 (AP)—Valentin Campa, representing the Railway Workers union, said 6200 employees of the Southern Pacific railroad of Mexico would walk off their jobs at 6 p. m. Wednesday to enforce their demand for a 160-peso (432) a month wage increase.

The railroad operates 2000 kilometers (1242 miles) of U. S. frontier from Guadalupe to the U. S. frontier at Nogales, Ariz., and two branch lines.

Bertollo New Police Head

BUENOS AIRES, June 5 (AP)—Gen. Arturo Bertollo recently decorated by the United States for outstanding service as Argentine delegate to the inter-American defense board, was sworn in today as chief of federal police.

He succeeded Gen. Plomenio J. Velasco, who resigned abruptly last night in circumstances which many interpreted as a dismissal.

The change in chiefs coincided with the arrest of Juan Wuerlito, leader of the Alianza Libertadora Nacionalista (National Freedom Al-

liance), on a charge of intervening in the current street cleaners' strike in Buenos Aires.

The developments were interpreted by political circles as an indication that President Juan Peron was turning against Argentina's extreme nationalists.
