

Bible School To Open On June Ninth

Inter-Faith Committee Proposes Education Plan

The inter-faith committee of Klamath Falls, composed of Protestant and Roman Catholic members, this week released an announcement regarding a proposal for "released time religious education." Members of the committee are Rev. David F. Barnett, Jr., Rev. Victor Phillips, Rev. S. M. Topness, Percy Murray, Kenneth Moore, and Lynn Roycroft.

"The first such school was started in 1914 in Gary, Ind., and has grown until it operates in 1800 American communities. Oregon cities which have such a program include Portland, Eugene, Grants Pass, and Lakeview.

"Such a program is undertaken with the conviction that religious education should be an integral part of every child, and that such training is basic in attacking juvenile behavior problems.

"More and detailed information will be released from time to time so that all citizens of the community may have ample opportunity to acquaint themselves with the working program of the proposed plan. It is not the intention of any concerned that hasty action be taken, nor that, should the program

be undertaken, large scale operation begin with its inception. "Requests for information may be addressed to the inter-faith committee."
