California First In Insurance Law (continued) The measure, already approved by the senate, gives insurance companies self-regulatory powers. The type of legislation involved was sponsored by congress about a year ago on the premise that unless the insurance companies regulated themselves and adopted procedures for uniform rate-making, governmental rate-making and control would be imposed.
