REGON'S Senators Cordon and Morse divided on the final passage last week-end of the labor union regulation bill which is now in the lap of President Truman.

The final vote in the senate was 54 to 17, and in the house, 320 to 79. These votes indicate the probability of passage over veto, if Mr. Truman should scratch the measure.

Provisions

- 1. Permits the government to get 80-day court injunctions against "national paralysis" strikes, such as a railroad or coal mine tie-up.

Argument will be seen from the above provisions that the bill goes much farther than anything suggested by President Truman in his state of the union message to congress in January.
