

Sales Tax Opposition Mounting

Oregon's proposed 3 per cent sales tax, which will be voted upon at a state election October 7, already has two strong opponents getting ready to fight the measure in the state grange and the state federation of labor.

The grange went on record as continuing its opposition to the tax at a convention in Bend last week, while the AFL took a unanimous stand against the tax in its state meeting at Bend yesterday.

Vote of the grange was not unanimous, but a local grange member who was at the Bend meeting said that the vote was heavy against the tax and that there was surprisingly little argument on the floor when the anti-sales tax resolution came up.

The Pomona of Klamath county has favored the tax all along, but some subordinate granges in the county are against it, so the Klamath delegation to Bend was split. Some other Pomona favor the sales tax, but the state grange as a whole takes the opposite view.

That stand is a traditional one for both the grange in Oregon and for organized labor, both taking the position that a sales tax hits the small income customer as well as the man with the large income and therefore is discriminatory toward small income bra kets.

Both the AFL and grange are expected to become increasingly active in the fight against the proposed sales tax this summer and early fall before the October 7 election. The tax was passed by the legislature this spring and referred to the people.

Fire Razes Warehouse

TACOMA, June 11 (AP)—Fire, apparently started by safecrackers during a futile attempt to make off with concession receipts, completely razed a storehouse at the Tacoma Tiger ball park early today. Damage was estimated at \$3000, all covered by insurance.

Tiger uniforms and other equipment, stored in an adjoining building, were not damaged and club officials said the blaze would not cause any interruption in the Tacoma schedule.

Fire department investigations were still being made this morning but the blaze appeared either to have been set deliberately or by a smoldering cigarette.

Destroyed in the fire were hot dogs, ice cream bars, pop, and other concession items as well as a number of seat cushions. Damage to the building was put at \$1000 and to the contents at \$2000.
