

19-Year-Old Negro Saved From Lynch Mob By Action Of Courageous Mayor

HURTSBORO, Ala., June 11 (AP)—A 19-year-old negro was alive today because Mayor Hurt Vann of this small, deep-south town had the courage to convince a lynch-mob that the law was better than the rope.

The negro, Jimmy Harris, thus became the second within the past three weeks to escape a southern mob intent on avenging the alleged attempted raping of two white women.

Harris was rescued yesterday by Mayor Vann, former Mayor H. M. Rutherford and his son, Phil, and City Councilman H. T. Ellison as he lay in the dirt, bound and with a rope around his neck.

Last May 23, Godwin Bush, 22, escaped from a masked band by catapulting himself from a car after he had been taken from the Jackson jail near Rich Square, N. C. Bush hid in a dense wood for 48 hours before surrendering himself.

Auto Firm Investigated

PHILADELPHIA, June 11 (AP)—The securities and exchange commission today instituted stop-order proceedings against the registration statement of the Tucker corporation (Chicago auto manufacturing firm organized July 8, 1946).

The statement filed last May 6, covering 4,000,000 shares of \$1 par value common stock "appears to include untrue statements of material facts," the commission charged.

The commission sent a hearing for June 16 to investigate the disclosures in the registration and to determine whether a stop order should be issued.

The SEC action climaxes an eight-day secret inquiry conducted here and in Chicago. No stock has been sold since the registration was not become effective.

Organized by Preston Tucker, well known builder of racing cars, the company proposed to offer the shares to the public through an underwriting syndicate headed by Floyd D. Serf company, Chicago, at \$5 a share with a 70-cent a share discount.

Vann said he told the crowd they ought to release the negro because "that is the best way—we ought to let the law take its course."

Hot and hot-tempered in the 90-degree-plus sun, had released Harris, Vann replied, "we all cooperate pretty good around here. I told them this was the best way. We didn't want to give the town a black eye."

The commission cited 17 items, including financial statements which it declared contained omission of fact or untrue statements.

Vann said the 125-pound negro had been seized by the mob after a white woman reported he broke into her home and attempted to rape her. The woman's screams, Vann related, brought a neighbor Reuben Streetman, who threw the negro into the street where he was grabbed by white men.

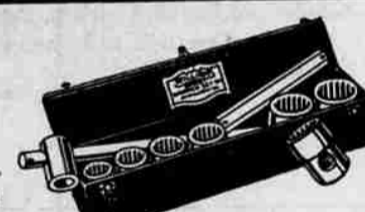

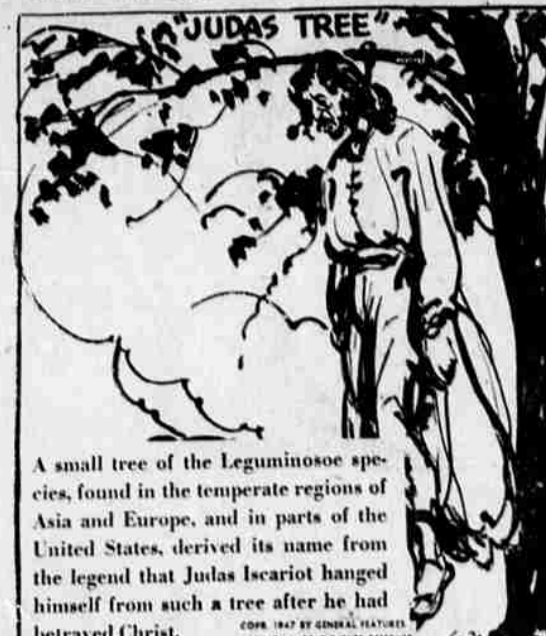

Missing American Veteran Found Working In Normandy

FRANKFURT, Germany, June 11 (AP)—An American veteran of D-Day, listed as killed in action in Normandy almost three years ago, has been found working as a blacksmith in a little Normandy village, the army announced today.

The veteran is Martin J. Papula of Plymouth, Pa. The army said Papula, who told French police he suffered temporary loss of memory after wounds suffered in heavy fighting, had submerged his identity in his new life.

"He apparently has lost most of his ability to speak English and now thinks in French," the announcement said.

Papula was found in April—and then only because of a village argument. His mother, Mrs. Hannah Papula of Plymouth, who had made special appeals to the army to find her boy's remains, has been notified.

Papula stormed ashore on Omaha beach on D-Day and took part in the heavy fighting during the American break-through at St. Lo.

"He suffered a slight concussion in the attack upon St. Lo and, after a short hospitalization, he returned to his unit," the army said. "A few days later he disappeared."

"Papula told the French gendarmerie that he had no recollection

of leaving his unit and that by the time he had recovered his memory, he did not dare to report himself to American or French authorities, fearing he would be tried as a deserter."

Papula went to Ariel, near Montabert, and took work as a laborer, winning an excellent reputation among the villagers. A quarrel between his employer and a neighboring farmer, however, revealed his whereabouts three years later. After the argument, the neighbor informed the gendarmerie of Papula's whereabouts.

He was turned over by the gendarmerie to American graves registration officials at Carentan, France.
