Forest Service Makes First Move In Getting Alaskan Industry Under Way

WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—The forest service today disclosed that it has taken the first concrete step toward promoting an Alaskan pulpwood and newsprint industry.

The service revealed details of a sample agreement it has prepared at the request of a group of West Coast and New York financiers, high interior and agriculture department officials said, for the sale of eight billion board feet of pulp timber near Petersburg, Wrangell and Thomas Bay, Alaska.

Under the agreement the successful bidder must have at least \$8,000,000 immediately available for plant construction. The financial group was described as eager to submit a bid. When bids can be asked depends on congressional action on pending legislation.

Identification Said Complete

NEW YORK, June 12 (AP)—Identities of 353 Alaskan soldiers who died in the Philippines during the Japanese occupation and were buried as unknowns have been established, the New York port of embarkation said today.

The 353 were among a group of approximately 1600 who were buried in the Camp O'Donnell prisoner of war cemetery on Luzon. After the end of fighting in the islands they were disinterred and reburied in the United States Armed Forces Cemetery Manila No. 2.

The rates are subject to readjustment by the forest service July 1, 1960, and at five-year intervals thereafter.

The forest service has decided to call for oral bids, but will accept sealed bids from approved bidders. The successful bidder, who must show working capital of at least \$8,000,000—less than a third of the estimated total cost of the project—must put up \$100,000 at the time his offer is accepted. This is to serve as a guarantee for a one-year option period in which the successful bidder will be permitted to qualify for the final agreement.

Children May Have Seen Murderer Of Massillon Babies

MASSILLON, Ohio, June 12 (AP)—Police Chief Stanley W. Switzer Wednesday said several child patients at Massillon city hospital "actually saw something" the night two infants were slain in the pediatric nursery.

In a news conference Chief Switzer disclosed that Dr. Peralta Simmons, chief psychologist of the bureau of juvenile research at Columbus, had questioned children patients who had been quartered on the same floor with the nursery at the time of the slaying last Friday night.

"It has been sifted down," Chief Switzer told newsmen, "to the fact the children actually saw something. We believe they saw something. But, they are too upset emotionally for us to determine just what they saw."

MacArthur Awarded Navy Medal

TOKYO, June 12 (AP)—General MacArthur was awarded the U. S. Navy's Distinguished Service medal today.

The citation lauded MacArthur for "brilliant mastery of all phases of combined warfare" in directing allied campaigns through the Bismarck archipelago, along the New Guinea coast and "in the islands to the westward."

The award was presented on behalf of President Truman by Vice Admiral Robert Griffin, commander of naval forces in the Far East.

ROME, June 12 (AP)—U. S. authorities said Wednesday the wife of Lt. Keith K. Monroe, of Williamsport, Pa., was wounded Monday night by gunfire near the Morgan line, which divides Yugoslav and American-British occupation forces.

Lt. and Mrs. Monroe were riding a jeep on official business when the vehicle was sprayed by a machinegun burst near Tiglio, the announcement said. Mr. Monroe was wounded in a leg by one of six bullets which struck the jeep.
