

Weyerhaeuser Develops Process To Utilize Douglas Fir Bark

LONGVIEW, Wash., June 13 (AP)—Once destroyed as useless waste, the bark of trees processed in a huge lumber mill here is being made into ingredients for phonograph records, explosives, adhesives, plastics and scores of other commercial products.

The Weyerhaeuser Timber company announced today that it had perfected a process for complete commercial utilization of Douglas fir bark, which roughly is 12 per cent of the log. This is the first time bark has been fully utilized on a commercial basis, and is a

School Work On Summer Slate Here

Several important improvements are on the summer work program in the seven elementary school buildings and at Klamath Union high school, according to Superintendent Arnold L. Gralapp.

All schools will have the usual and routine improvement work done but at least two will see extensive improvements made. At Mills school the big job is re-flooring the gymnasium with hardwood and this will take considerable time.

Fairview school will have two classrooms added to meet the increased enrollment. The present cafeteria lunchroom will be turned into a classroom and this necessitates building a new cafeteria lunchroom and installing equipment. Another classroom will be made out of the girls' play area and in the future the gymnasium will have to be used for play by all students, Gralapp said.

The rear of the main building at Fremont school will have an outside stucco paint job in addition to the usual renovation and at Conger school will be improved in front of the school.

Roosevelt, Riverside and Pelican will have routine improvements which always follow the summer clean-up program. Janitors are on duty full time at all the schools and woodwork will be washed and the buildings thoroughly cleaned.

At Klamath Union high school new sidewalk approaches on the Esplanade side will be installed and the front steps, which have disintegrated, will be replaced. Angle walks leading directly to the library and gym sections, will also be laid. A new pumping arrangement for Moeck field and the new addition are being installed and Gralapp said that work is being completed as rapidly as possible on the new tennis courts in order that the area be available for use immediately.
