A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL TO PAVE AND IMPROVE APPLE-GATE AVENUE, ITS INTERSECTION WITH MITCHELL AVENUE, ITS INTERSECTION WITH WASHBURN WAY, AND DECLARING AND DIRECTING CERTAIN STEPS BE TAKEN IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; SAID PROJECT TO BE KNOWN AS IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 94.

WHEREAS, the City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, on the 2nd day of June, 1947, filed plans, specifications and estimates for the cost of improving Apple-gate Avenue from its east intersection with Mitchell Avenue, to its west intersection with Washburn Way, said improvement to be known as IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 94, and the common council, at its regular session, said project and estimates satisfactory;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, DULY ASSEMBLED IN REGULAR SESSION, AS FOLLOWS:

Section I
That said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said portions of said street, being filed here on June 2nd, 1947, be and the same hereby approved, and said project shall be known as IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 94.

Section II
That the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of said streets in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates as follows:

Said improvement to consist of cement or asphalt pavement six inches in depth and thirty feet in width, including cement curbs.

The estimated cost of all classes of improvements embracing all work and materials for the complete improvement of said project for each type of pavement being as follows:

Cement concrete pavement—\$12,286.76
Asphalt concrete pavement—\$12,286.76
Said estimates include engineering, supervision, advertising, clerical assistance, attorney's fees and unforeseen contingencies.

Section III
That the property lying within the boundaries hereinafter described be and the same is hereby declared to be benefited by said improvement, to-wit: Beginning at the northwest corner of lot 632 in block 129 West Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence east along the south line of the alley in said block 129 to the west line of Washburn Way; thence south along the north line of the alley in said block 129 to said Mills Addition; thence west along the north line of said alley to the east line of Mitchell; thence north along the east line of Mitchell to the point of beginning.

That all the property included in the aforesaid boundaries above described be and the same is hereby declared to be benefited by said improvement and assessed for the expense thereof.

Section IV
That Monday, July 7, 1947, at the hour of 7:30 P. M. at the Council Chamber of the City Hall in Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed as the time and place for hearing of objections and remonstrances against said proposed improvement.

Section V
That the Mayor and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of such hearing to be published as provided by the City Charter of said City and shall publish this resolution as provided by law.
