

Kneilson's Tricks In Tag Match

Heavy and tricky Stocky Kneilson, the bearded Tennessee mountain man, and the plumpie Herb Parks are teamed up on the meane side of Thursday night's wrestling mainliner, a tag team match with a one hour time limit.

Their opposite numbers across the ring will be the popular Pierre LaBelle, and the equally popular Jack Kiser. The latter has been a regular performer here for a number of years, but for the past several months has been out in the islands.

Kiser is one of the smaller men in the bracket, and LaBelle isn't

The opening bout of the card will be a full-scale five rounder, with Buck Weaver and Buck Davidson doing the battling.

Bob Locke, Tired After 33 Rounds, Qualifying For PGA

DETROIT, June 18 (AP)—Bobby Locke, the smiling, ruddy-complexioned South African star, continued his brilliant run of American golf tournaments here today by teeing off with 137 rivals in the first qualifying round for the week-long national PGA championship but admitted he was "fatigued" after playing 33 rounds of competitive golf in the United States at an average score of 69.3 strokes a round.

Locke, off his tie for third in the U. S. open last week and his victories in such features as the Houston open, Philadelphia Inquirer invitational and Goodall round-robin tournaments, rated well up with the

favorites as the long scramble over Plum Hollow's rolling 6922-yard par 72 layout began.

Defending Champion Ben Hogan, whose full game is made to order for Plum Hollow's design, remained the man to beat.

Other well-liked stars included Sam Snead, British open champ and U. S. runner-up, who was 11 under par for his two practice rounds of 66 and 67 since he arrived here; Lew Worsham of Pittsburgh, who beat Snead in the open playoff; Ed "Porky" Oliver of Wilmington, Del., who went to the finals a year ago at Portland, Ore., before bowing to Hogan; and Jimmy Demaret, the crowning Texan now playing out of Ojai, Calif., who leads the 1947 tournament money-winning parade.

Payroll Tax Rate Frozen

WASHINGTON, June 18 (AP)—The house passed unanimously today a bill freezing the social security payroll tax at present rates for two years.

If passed by the senate and accepted by President Truman the measure will block an automatic \$2,000,000,000 annual increase in the levy on January 1.

The legislation provides, however, for an increase in the tax in 1950 to from one per cent to 1.5 per cent each against employers' pay and employers' payrolls. In 1957 the tax would jump to two per cent against each.

Without the freeze, the levy would have increased January 1 to 2.5 per cent against employer and employee. The present one per cent tax affects about \$1,500,000,000 annually for the social security old age and survivors insurance program.

Oregon Employers Save In Jobless Tax Reductions

SALEM, June 18 (AP)—Oregon employers will save almost \$7,000,000 in unemployment tax rate reductions in 1947, bringing to \$25,000,000 the total savings to employers since experience rating became effective six years ago, the state unemployment compensation commission said today.

The average unemployment tax rate this year is 1.7 per cent of payrolls, and the highest rate is 2.7 per cent. The lowest rate is .5 of 1 per cent. About half of the state's 15,000 employers can qualify for the lower rates under experience rating.

The commission paid out \$625,004 during May to unemployed persons who were not veterans, compared with \$2,045,477 in May, 1946. Benefits in the first five months of this year totaled \$4,182,435, compared with \$11,748,044 in the similar period of last year.

The commission said the state's civilian labor force now is past the 550,000 mark, compared with the record high of 593,500 in June, 1943.

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Rival Coaches Not Happy Over Prospects In NCAA

SALT LAKE CITY, June 18 (AP)—The two coaches whose teams are considered most likely to succeed in this week-end's NCAA track and field meet are not counting their points before they are scored.

Neither Coach Leo Johnson of Illinois nor Dean Cromwell of Southern California neglected today to consider the possibility that New York university and Penn State possess enough potential power to win the title Saturday night. Prelims are Friday night.

Johnson brought only nine members of his defending champion Illinois team along, but three of them

will be attempting to keep their individual titles in four events.

The cinders were given some rough treatment today as coaches of Connecticut, Washington, North Carolina, Minnesota, Pittsburgh, Ohio State, Michigan, Yale, Michigan State and San Jose State put their boys through some practice sessions.

Don Wold of Washington university, who placed second in the mile event last year, looked good in practice sessions.

Heavy Scoring Features Tilts

GAMES began last night among the teams of the YMCA church league, with the First Baptist outfit trouncing the First Christian church 18-2 in the A league. The Nazarene B team overcame the First Christian B's, 16-10.

The A league games will be played at the high school practice field on the diamond nearest the cleaners and the B games will be held on the Mills school diamond.

Moths Threaten Umatilla Forest

WASHINGTON, June 18 (AP)—Senator Morse (R-Ore.) said today the forestry service had arranged to treat about 14,000 acres in the Umatilla national forest to prevent infestation by Tussock moth.

The senator said the service informed him it had arranged its funds so as to provide money for spraying insecticide upon the forest from airplanes.

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Consent Paper Rule Cancelled

Consent papers are no longer required for young men who have reached their 18th birthday and wish to enlist in the navy, the local navy recruiting office announced today. Also they may enlist for a period of only three years with the present ruling.

For men who have served in the USN, USN-1 or USNR and reenlist within 90 days, enlistments may be had for periods of two, three, four or six years.

Enlistment or reenlistment in the peacetime USNR does not qualify men for enlistment or reenlistment in the regular navy under continuous service.
