

# Pioneer Keno Man's Death Told

Klamath county was saddened today by the passing of Joseph Hathaway Foster, a pioneer in this community since 1903.

Mr. Foster was taken to Klamath Valley hospital Sunday where he succumbed to a heart ailment at 10:10 p. m. Monday, at the age of 59.

He had been a resident of Keno for the past 18 years where he was postmaster since 1938, until the time of his death. He had put in a full day at the post office Saturday as usual and suffered a light heart attack Saturday night which he did not mention to his family until he had a recurrence Sunday morning.

Keno's genial postmaster was born in 1887, November 9, at Point Arena, Mendocino county, Calif. He came to Klamath county with his parents in a wagon when he was 16 and he worked with his father in the Round lake district raising cows, hogs, rye, wheat and oats and feeding his own cattle. He cut firewood in Klamath forests and sold it by the wagonload in Klamath Falls.

At the age of 21 he took over the management of his father's place. Soon after this he filed on a homestead at Malibu. In 1920 he came to Keno where he fell timber for several years for Weyerhaeuser Timber company until he accepted a position as janitor of Keno schools. He was appointed as postmaster in April, 1938.

Mr. Foster was married July 1, 1916 in Klamath Falls. He is survived by his wife, Mabel F. Foster of Keno, two sons, Walter S. and Warren H. of Keno, one grandchild, Walter J. Foster of Keno, two brothers, Charles of Grass Valley, Calif., and Steve of Seattle, Wash. Five sisters, Mrs. H. R. Moore of Chico, Calif., Mrs. L. R. Brannan of Klamath Falls, Mrs. Bruce Purdy of Coquille, Mrs. George Nees of San Francisco and Mrs. Henry Ravenscroft of Petaluma, Calif.

Funeral arrangements are being made by Ward's Klamath Funeral home, and services will be held sometime Thursday afternoon in the chapel. The time to be announced later. Interment will be in Keno cemetery.

### Rent Control Extension OK

WASHINGTON, June 18 (AP)—The house accepted Tuesday a joint congressional committee's recommendations on the terms of a measure to extend rent control until February 29, 1948.

The action came on a standing vote of 163 to 73 after the house, by a standing tally of 114 to 87, rejected a move to send the measure back to a house-senate conference committee for further study.

The legislation now goes to the senate. Included in the bill is a controversial provision permitting a 15 per cent hike in rents when landlords and tenants "voluntarily" get together "in good faith" and agree to the boost in exchange for a lease through 1948.

The measure also would free building materials from controls except for amusement and recreational construction.
