

Atlantic, Gulf Coast Seamen Reach Agreement To End Shipping Tie-Up

NEW YORK, June 19 (AP)—Negotiating committees for three maritime unions and 29 East and Gulf coast shippers reached an agreement early today for settlement of the shipping tie-up on those coasts on the basis of a five per cent wage increase.

The settlement agreement, announced at 1:40 a. m. (EST) by John W. Gibson, assistant secretary of labor, would benefit 110,000 seamen on the Atlantic and Gulf coasts if approved by the unions' memberships and by the shipowners.

Two Die In Auto Crash

SEATTLE, June 19 (AP)—Walter A. Williams, about 31, and Phyllis Venable, 25, both of Seattle, were killed in the pre-dawn hours today when two cars collided on the Seattle-Tacoma highway bridge at Tacoma's east city limits.

Three Seattle persons were hurt, two critically, and John Schaefer, 30, of Stellacom, an employee at the McNeil island penitentiary, was injured. Police placed Schaefer under technical arrest as a material witness.

Critically hurt were Harold Ford (age not known), of the U. S. naval air reserve training unit at Seattle, and Harvey M. Lim, 28, Miami Preston, 28, was seriously injured. Hospital attendants said Ford had a 50-50 chance for survival.

There were no witnesses to the crash and the injured were unable to tell of it at an early hour this morning. Investigating officers said the cars had apparently sideswiped each other. They placed the time of the crash at 1:04 a. m.

Reece Raps Demo Actions

SPOKANE, June 19 (AP)—B. Carroll Reece, national chairman for the republican party, declared last night the democratic administration and party "over the past 14 years have played ball with radical groups and elements in return for the political support which those groups were able to supply."

The party leader, speaking at a republican banquet, added that he was "not accusing President Truman, or his immediate advisers, of any conscious purpose to subvert our form of government or to destroy our economic system. Mr. Truman, I am sure, is no more of a communist than I am."

He said three basic aims of the communists had been accomplished in this country during the 14 years and listed them as:

1. Debasing the currency.
2. Attack the institution of private property.
3. Create as much economic confusion and class friction as possible.

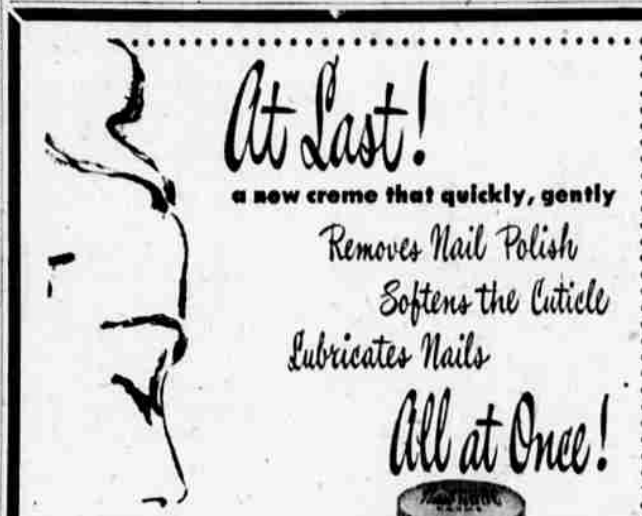
