

Klamath Tribe On Record As Opposing Any Move To Liquidate Reservation

The Klamath tribal business committee has gone on record as opposing an attempt by the congress to liquidate the Klamath Indian reservation.

In a strongly worded resolution unanimously approved by the committee at a meeting on June 5, condemnation was heaped on those people and organizations "not directly interested" who had seen fit to discuss the proposed liquidation without regard to the welfare of the Klamath, Modoc and Yachoskin Indian tribes.

Object of the resolution was to voice the Indian's opposition to senate bill S-1224, which was introduced in the United States senate last May

2 by Senators Morse and Gordon of Oregon.

Under provisions of the bill, the Klamath reservation would be liquidated and the Klamath tribes of Indians would be given full citizenship. They would no longer be classed as wards of the government.

The Klamath tribal business committee believes this action would be a mistake. They contend a majority of the members of the tribes are not ready to assume the full responsibility that would be entailed should the bill become law. Reference to the Indian's lack of protection against unscrupulous people, the resolution states "they would be literally robbed right and left."

Kenai Fire Roars Over Timberland

Robinson estimated the fire has already destroyed 60,000 acres of some of the best timber in the game reserve and has cost the lives of many moose and other wild game in the reserve.
