Wilson To Head Turkish Aid Program

WASHINGTON, June 19 (AP)—President Truman today nominated Edwin C. Wilson, ambassador to Turkey, to be chief of the American mission under the \$100,000,000 Turkish aid program.

The nomination, which had been expected, was sent to the senate along with the appointment of Charles E. Saltzman, vice president of the New York stock exchange, as an assistant secretary of state.

Wilson, a native of Palatka, Fla., and a veteran diplomat, will handle the Turkish aid job in addition to his duties as ambassador. The Turkish aid is part of a \$400,000,000 program to bulwark Turkey and Greece against communism.

Saltzman, a graduate of the U. S. military academy, served as a brigadier general in World War II and received the distinguished service medal. He returned to the New York stock exchange early in 1946.

There was some confusion concerning the post Saltzman would take. Neither the White House or state department has disclosed there is any vacancy in the assistant secretaryships.

Both Assistant Secretary of State John H. Hilldring, in charge of occupation policy, and Assistant Secretary William Benton, in charge of the office of public affairs, are slated to go. But Hilldring recently advised newsmen that he would be at the state department through the summer. Benton's retirement has not been expected until the congress-

ional controversy over funds for the state department's information program is settled.
