

Hoyt Sounds Grim Warning Of War With Russia If U. S. Foreign Policy Weakens

PORTLAND, June 20 (AP)—American publishers today issued a warning that they must settle on a strong foreign policy quickly or face the possibility of a "complete extinction."

Palmer Hoyt, editor and publisher of the *Denver Post*, told the Northwest Institute of International Relations last night that the solution of the problem of peace admits of no delay. "It is already clear that we have squandered a great deal of time," he said.

He advocated the immediate strengthening of the armed forces and expansion of the Truman doctrine.

FBI Captures Oregon Men

ST. PAUL, Minn., June 20 (AP)—The FBI late last night reported capture of two escaped Oregon convicts in a stolen car near Deadwood, S. D.

M. B. Rhodes, FBI agent, identified them as Ross Leon Seagrave, 23, and Wayne Robinson, 21. They escaped from the Salem, Ore., penitentiary two weeks ago, walking away from their jobs as waiters in the guards' quarters.

Rhodes said the car in which they rode had been stolen at Grants Pass, Ore., June 9, then resisted arrest, he said.

Leo Flynn, U. S. district attorney at Sioux Falls, S. D., is to decide whether to prosecute the pair under the Dyer auto theft act or to turn them over to Oregon authorities.

Seagrave was serving a nine-month auto theft term from Roseburg. He would have been eligible for parole July 17. Robinson was serving two years for forgery from Medford. He would have been eligible for parole next November 3.

U-O Students Set Up Camp

CHILQUIN, June 20 (AP)—A group of University of Oregon students, headed by Leo L. S. Crossman, professor of anthropology, have set up camp on the Wolff ranch at Williamson River and are prepared to make geological and archaeological investigations in the northern Klamath region.

There are 12 students ranging in credits from a sophomore to one home as far north as Wenatchee, homes as far north as Wenatchee, Wash., to the southern point of Long Beach, Calif.

Mascot for the group is Jim Stark, young son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Stark of Klamath Falls. The cook, J. Hood of Portland, and Director Crossman complete the group.

Field work will be in session until July 25.

No Return To Low Prices Seen

PORTLAND, June 20 (AP)—Prices will never get back to prewar levels, says the National Retail Dry Goods association, predicted last night.

Indian Education Funds Boosted

WASHINGTON, June 20 (AP)—Senate action in increasing funds to permit continued operation of all Indian schools sent an appropriation bill before a house-senate conference committee today.

The senate boosted the house appropriation for Indian education from \$8,000,000 to \$11,800,000. Funds were not earmarked specifically for separate schools, but the Indian bureau said the increase would keep all open.

Coast Guard Rescue Plane

SEATTLE, June 20 (AP)—The coast guard reported this morning it had dispatched a plane from its Port Angeles air station to Bull harbor on Hope Island, B. C., to pick up a fishing vessel crew member who had suffered a heart attack.

The man's name was not known but the coast guard report said he was understood to be elderly. The vessel was the Shirley Lee, a 70-foot craft owned by J. C. McMillan, whose address was not available to the coast guard. It was thought the craft came from a Columbia river port.

The ship was about 15 miles north-west of Cox island, B. C., when the information was received at 2 a. m., the report added. The plane was to fly the man to a Seattle hospital.
