

Sudden Blizzard Traps Tourists In Mountain Pass, Killing Three

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK, Wyo., June 22 (AP)— Lights from a tiny trailer were "something out of Heaven" to one of 70 summer vacationists seeking refuge from a howling week-end blizzard which trapped them on a barren mountain pass, killing three persons and injuring at least four others.

When Bob Helm of Missoula, Mont., member of a volunteer patrol of ex-army ski troopers, reached the drift-covered trailer, owned by Dr. Engelberg of Sacramento, Calif., he found 17 persons, nine of them children, huddled around its tiny stove for warmth "exceedingly happy to see us."

Dug Out Of Cars

Other persons, dug out of trapped cars by the patrol and national park service crews operating huge snowplows, were carried to safety on toboggans and then autos after more than 24 harrowing hours.

Relations Confab Ends

FOREST GROVE, June 22 (AP)— The Northwest Institute of International Relations closed its 13th session with Admiral Richmond K. Turner, naval observer at the United Nations assembly, blaming a communist designed chasm obstructing UN progress.

The communist group, while professing idealistic international intentions, is engaged in an ideological and economic warfare designed for the deliberate destruction of the stability of the governments and social structures of nations not already under communist domination. World security is at stake, he told the group.

The navy officer outlined American foreign policy, which he said is a long range program requiring the support of military might, until international councils can achieve an organization in which the world can have confidence.

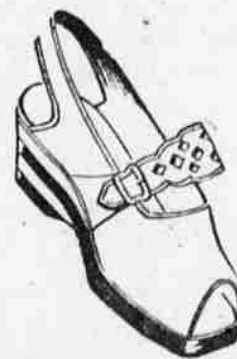
