

## 2 Methodist Districts In

PORTLAND, June 23 (AP)—Oregon Methodists today had two new district superintendents—the Rev. S. Laynor Smith for the newly created southern Oregon district and the Rev. Joseph M. Adams for the Portland district.

Both were elevated from Salem pastorates. The Rev. Adams coming from the First Methodist church here and the Rev. Smith from Mason Lee church. The Rev. Adams succeeds Dr. H. Guy Goodsell, retired.

All three Methodist churches in Salem will have new pastors. They are: First Methodist, the Rev. Brooks Moore, from Idaho Falls; Mason Lee, the Rev. Louis Kirby from Medford; Leslie, the Rev. G. Wesley Turner, transfer from an outside conference succeeding the Rev. Joseph Knotts, retired.

## Leave Pay Notice Out

Oregon's student veterans who desire leave pay under the GI bill will be required to apply at least 30 days in advance during any school term ending after July 31. Zeno H. Dent, veterans administration training officer here, announced today.

In explaining this new ruling, Dent pointed out that school terms which end on or before July 31, the ex-GI student may still apply as in the past, at any time before the term ends, for his accrued leave.

First summer terms at Oregon colleges end before that deadline, but all second summer sessions, and a few others, come to a close in August or September. Leave pay under public law 346 cannot be obtained following any term which ends in August or later, unless the veterans administration has received a leave request 30 days or more in advance.

Subsistence is paid for leave time at the rate of 2 1/2 days a month, although this must be deducted from the veteran's total entitlement for training.

Applications for leave may be submitted to the VA training officer at the school or mailed directly to the VA's regional office, 1019 S. W. Tenth avenue, Portland.

## Camp Fire News

Camp Fire Girls from all over the community will open the ground to bake potatoes on their 875th anniversary camp-out all night, Tuesday, June 24, on the Geary ranch, one mile north of Moore park.

To fulfill a rank requirement, each girl must participate in a camping trip on which she must take a responsible part in completing plans for the preparation of three outdoor meals, making the menus, purchasing and packing the food, and carrying it "chobo" fashion on a one-mile hike. Each group member is assuming a spirit of adventure as she examines the many outdoor recipes and methods of cooking by fireside. The girls will leave noon, Tuesday, and return at that hour Wednesday.

With the approach of Lake of the Woods camping dates, August 3 and August 10, many girls are working and hoping to pass this and other requirements through the court of awards, which is being arranged for the week before the camp's opening. To be awarded the purple rankbeads during the impressive grand ceremonial around the open fire is every Camp Fire Girl's dream.

In order to fill up the openings in the second week, camp registration will remain open through noon, Saturday, June 28. The office in Miller's store will be open from 10 a. m. to 12 noon and from 2 p. m. to 5 p. m., Monday through Saturday, until the closing date. All purchasing and ordering of needed Camp Fire, Bluebird and camp clothing can now be done at the store.

Mrs. J. K. McAndrews was appointed chairman of the campship award committee at the June 18 leaders' meeting in the Presbyterian church rooms. Every year an award that will send a worthy girl to summer camp will be given by the leaders' association. This year's winner, chosen on good standing, advancement, interest, and genuine need will be announced soon. Need for better leadership was expressed by Mrs. A. ## Vet Auto Plea Made

A last call for amputee veterans to apply for free automobiles costing up to \$1600 was issued today by Patrick W. Kirby, veterans administration representative in this area, who stated that June 30 is the deadline under present federal legislation.

In Oregon, 159 disabled ex-GI's who lost, or lost the use of, one or both legs at or above the ankle have been approved for government-purchased cars, trucks or tractors, Kirby said. Vehicles have actually been delivered to 129 of these disabled veterans.

Other eligible ex-servicemen are urged to apply at the local VA office now, as several days may be needed by regional office to establish eligibility. The veteran still has two years in which to pick out his car, but \$1600 must be earmarked by the VA for his purchase by Monday, June 30.
