

Baby Bomb Used At Bikini Seen As Weapon Of Future By War Department Heads

NEW YORK, June 30 (AP)—The first Bikini bomb, exploded a year ago today (it was July 1 at Bikini) may be the size that will be used mostly to fight atomic wars of the future, instead of the greater bombs which scientists have been predicting.

This forecast is made for the war department general staff by Dr. R. E. Lapp of the research and development division. The Bikini bomb was average for all five used to date. The prediction is based on the fact that most military targets will not need bigger atom bombs, coupled with the probability that greater bombs would be wasting money.

Fire Danger Held Grave

SAN FRANCISCO, June 30—Because of the particularly dry winter and spring season and the great amount of natural resources in forest and woodland in California, Oregon, Washington, Arizona, Nevada, Montana and Utah, a grave fire hazard faces the Pacific coast region, the national board of Fire Underwriters' Pacific coast office said here today.

Each year more than 175,000 forest fires throughout the United States consume 25,000,000 acres of valuable timber and watershed—an area which is as large as the state of Virginia. This direct loss to natural resources amounts to over \$36,000,000.

The hazard is greatest on the Pacific coast and western states because of the long summer dry season, and the dependence of the entire region on forest and brush areas for water supply and flood and erosion control.

"Most forest and brush fires are preventable," said R. C. Stange, assistant general manager of the board in San Francisco. "A survey made for President Truman's conference on fire prevention held in Washington last May showed that almost all fires in forests start because of careless smokers and improperly handled campfires."

in a city instead of directly attacking the war factories in or around the city.
Dr. Lapp estimates that an average of 50,000 deaths can be expected from one bomb dropped on a city, plus another 50,000 serious injuries. This might be tried, he says, where the killing and maiming of civilians, with the great disruption of normal living to be expected, would reduce the number of workers enough to paralyze production.

Slow Development
Adm. Parsons says atomic weapons are works of evolution, rather than revolution, and that prospects are for slow development. He concludes that at least for the coming generation, control of the sea will continue to be decisive.

Adm. Parsons says it would be the height of folly to rush ahead now with instruments that might burn up an appreciable fraction of the world's known supply of irreplaceable uranium, when a few more years of research may multiply the stores of usable atomic fuel a generation hence.
