John Cattrell ran the infield through a long drill before the day's workout was concluded with a game.

Cattrell, Syl Johnson and Bob Fatjo, who are conducting the clinic, reported a dearth of catchers and are having difficulty in finding anyone capable of donning the pad and mask and giving the pitchers needed support from behind the plate.

Several hurlers are working out, and the scouts particularly were eyeing Jim Bart, former chucker for Columbia Prep. of Portland now working at Roseburg, and Jay Quigley, who carries the pitching load for the Klamath Junior Sons.

Bart has displayed a loose, easy style which has been an eye-catcher to scouts and spectators alike and Quigley, despite a bruised throwing arm received in the Lakeview tilt last Sunday seems to have plenty on the ball.

The lads attending the school are working and sweating hard but all voice approval and satisfaction concerning the coaches and instruction. Though slightly on the warm side, the weather has been ideal for baseball workouts and the field is in excellent condition in spite of hard usage.

US Treasury Shows Surplus

WASHINGTON, July 2 (AP)—Secretary of the Treasury Snyder announced today the government finished the 1947 fiscal year Monday with a budget surplus of almost \$754,000,000.

That was approximately \$500,000,000 less than President Truman had estimated on April 19 and \$401,000,000 below the record high set under President Coolidge exactly 20 years ago.

But it was the first surplus in 17 years and it broke up a string of deficits that began under Herbert Hoover and had continued under Presidents Franklin D. Roosevelt and Truman.

Snyder told a news conference that the surplus—which represents the amount that government income exceeded spending over the past 12 months—already has been applied on the national debt.

With that amount included, debt retirement over the fiscal year totaled \$11,522,000,000, Snyder said.

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UAW Seeks Ford Peace

DETROIT, July 2 (AP)—The CIO United Auto Workers today sought the role of peacemaker in the six-week strike of 3,800 unionized foremen at the Ford Motor Co.

The UAW-CIO international executive board skirted a request from the striking Foreman's Association of America (Ind.) that its 85,000 Ford production workers respect picket lines at three local plants.

Instead, the board directed Vice President Richard T. Leonard to seek an audience with the Ford management "in an effort to resolve the controversy."
