WASHINGTON, July 7 (AP)—Mrs. Elizabeth Skinner Ives, 49, wife of Senator Ives (R-N.Y.), died early today in Bainbridge, N. Y., the senator's office reported. William Grant, administrative assistant to Ives, told newsmen that Mrs. Ives had been ill for two years and had been unable to join her husband here. Grant said Mrs. Ives, a Wellesley graduate, died at the home of her mother, Mrs. George Skinner, in Bainbridge.

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil, July 7 (AP)—Mme. Ernesto Undreanu, wife of the secretary of former King Carol of Romania, said today Elena Lupescu "passed the crisis" of her grave illness last night and "we even hope that the improvement she shows will lead to her recovery." The auburn-haired woman sought Thursday to legalize in marriage her 23-year-old relationship with the former monarch, who twice has reigned hastily from the troubled Romanian throne. She has undergone four transfusions for anemia. Mrs. Undreanu said "Madame Lupescu this morning is better." "Of course nobody can tell," she said. "Yesterday we thought it would be a matter of hours but during the night, which physicians said would bring the crisis, she showed strength and this morning seemed better." **Forest Fire Prevention Program Set**

J. V. LaClair, Keep Oregon Green chairman for Klamath county, has been asked to step up activities of his fire prevention committee for the next 90 days in an effort to save millions of dollars of forests and valuable crop land. The urgent appeal for help came from Dean Paul M. Dunn, state chairman of Keep Oregon Green.

"With proper care," Dean Dunn said, "it will be possible to reduce the annual average of 450 man-caused fires in Oregon during the next 90 days. Most citizens are careful while traveling in the woods, but we always have the small fraction who ignore all safety rules and unknowingly start most of our fires."

**Frequent Warnings**  
Dean Dunn urged the local chairman to send out frequent warnings during the summer in the hopes that some fire destruction can be curbed locally.

"Children of your county deserve special citations," Dean Dunn said, "for the wonderful spirit of enthusiasm they have brought to the Green Guards and Keep Oregon Green. I can only hope that these young people may be effective where every other type of appeal has failed to reach the minds of the deliberate destroyers who drop firebrands along highways and in our dry woods."

Dean Dunn announced that Charles Ogle, Salem, executive secretary of Keep Oregon Green, is now starting a statewide tour designed to reach every county. Mr. Ogle will visit with Keep Oregon Green leaders in nearly every city.

A number of local citizens have been asked by Governor Earl Snell to serve on the county Keep Oregon Green committee. Those already receiving invitations to join in this vital work are: William O. Morrow, Fred Heilbronner, Bill McKibbin, Carl Schubert, H. H. Ogle, Pat Kilby, A. H. Bussman and Francis Skinner.

**Vets Revive GI Insurance**

As the August 1 deadline draws near for revival by veterans of their lapsed GI insurance without a physical examination, new thousands of Oregon reinstatements are pouring into the veterans administration's Northwest insurance center at Seattle. Patrick W. Kilby, VA representative for this area, reported today.

For the two-week period ending June 25, 5682 Oregon reinstatements went on VA records. Value of this insurance put back in force came to \$37,331,500.

Since the VA's intensive information program began five months ago, 8570 Oregon veterans have reinstated \$39,157,000 worth of national service life insurance. In the Northwest, more than 22,000 have revived their policies amounting to more than \$225,000,000.

**Poor Salmon Run Closes Two Areas**

WASHINGTON, July 7 (AP)—The fish and wildlife service said Saturday poor salmon runs have closed the important Chignik and Kodiak areas in Alaska temporarily to commercial fishing.

The agency ordered Chignik fishing closed for 10 days starting at 6 p. m. Alaskan time, Saturday. The ban will be lifted at 6 a. m. July 14.

The Kodiak area, reporting a "very weak" run, was closed June 12. It will remain closed to commercial salmon fishing until and unless the number of fish increases considerably.

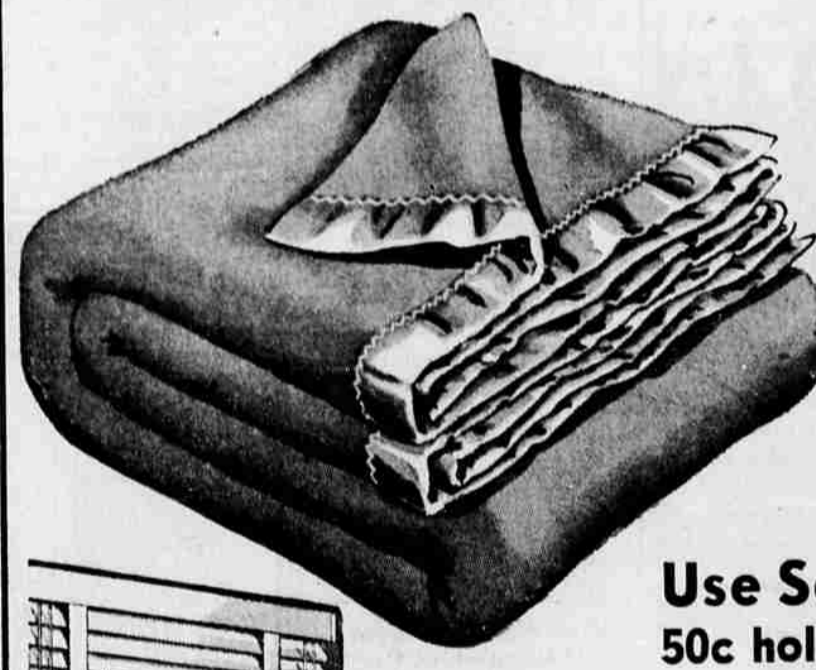

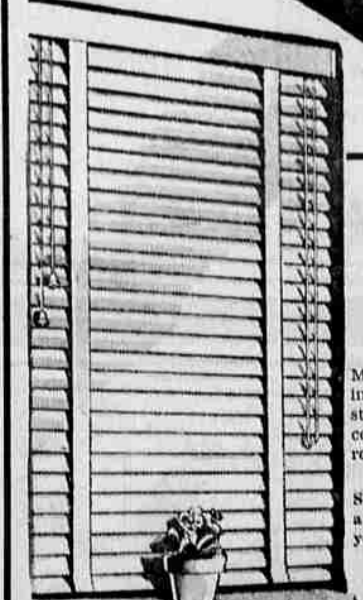

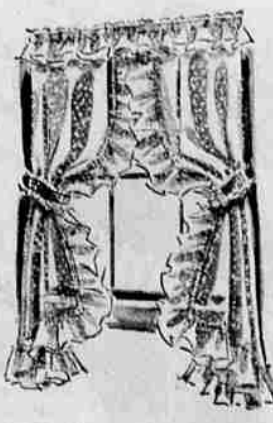
