**Richland Plutonium Plant Improvement Program Set**

NEW YORK, July 7—A program for improvements in making plutonium the main bomb metal, in the great atomic plant near Richland, Wash., was announced today by the atomic energy commission in a release issued by the General Electric company, which is to do the main work.

Plutonium, the hard, heavy metal made by transmuting uranium, is the principal announced substance in present atomic bombs.

Plutonium is the main future re-learner for atomic bombs. Scientists have reported that the transmutation will yield much more atomic fuel or explosive than use of uranium alone.

Plutonium is also at present the world's most significant atomic material for military purposes. Scientific publications have stated that other nations can produce this metal probably more cheaply and readily than any other bomb stuff.

Although the United States spent over \$2,000,000,000 to produce atomic bombs, the plutonium cost alone was only about \$700,000,000 and plutonium alone was sufficient.

The announcement said a major part of the Washington state program would be installation of chemical processing plants. Chemistry is one of the most important phases of plutonium-making.

What the improvements are will remain complete secrets, the commission stated. But one fact was disclosed. These modifications were worked out to a large extent at Argonne National laboratory, Chicago, after construction of the Hanford Works, as the plutonium plant is officially named.

This means that advances in the art of plutonium-making are assured. The Argonne laboratory was even during the war one of the principal sources of plutonium science and engineering.

The commission says that some other new work in plutonium by this program comes from studies begun by the DuPont company, which built the Hanford Works and operated them until General Electric took over last September.

**Disappointment Follows On First Telescopic Viewing**

Operators of astronomical telescopes hear occasional expressions of dissatisfaction from those who for the first time view the heavenly bodies through such instruments. "Although the surface details are clear, the moon looks no larger than to the naked eye." "Yes, I see the rings of Saturn, but the whole thing is so tiny." "I can't see anything on

in diameter and 30 inches long, is also in use just to show that magnification does take place. Each guest is asked to look through the telescope with one eye and along the outside of the tube with the other. He simultaneously sees two moons against the sky, one magnified and the other not. He then easily perceives that the magnified image appears about 20 times wider than the other. A large telescope cannot so easily be used for this as the width of the tube blocks the view of the moon from the "outside" eye.

Saturn and Jupiter when viewed with only moderate powers appear fully as large as the naked-eye moon. This is easily shown when the moon is not far from the planet. The planet is viewed through the instrument with one eye while the "outside" eye looks at the moon. This proof greatly surprises most guests. That a sky object considered nearby seems small is shown by the fact that a disc held at arm's length completely hides the full moon. Real stars are so inconceivably distant that no telescope makes them appear larger. But they do seem immensely brighter. Tens of thousands of stellar points entirely invisible without optical aid are brought into view. If a star is double, the magnification of the glass will spread the two farther apart, although each individual star remains a point of light.

Good telescopes reveal celestial glories so numerous as to defy attempted descriptions.
