He was graduated in engineering last month. For the spring term, 76, including 54 veterans, had perfect grades.

Earl C. Reynolds Jr., is the son of Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Reynolds of the Merrill road and Boise, Idaho. The young scholastic leader at Oregon State also won high honors while a student at Klamath Union high school. He attended Fremont grade school here, when his father was secretary of the Klamath County chamber of commerce.

Reynolds served in the armed forces during the war, returning to Oregon State to conclude his courses in engineering.

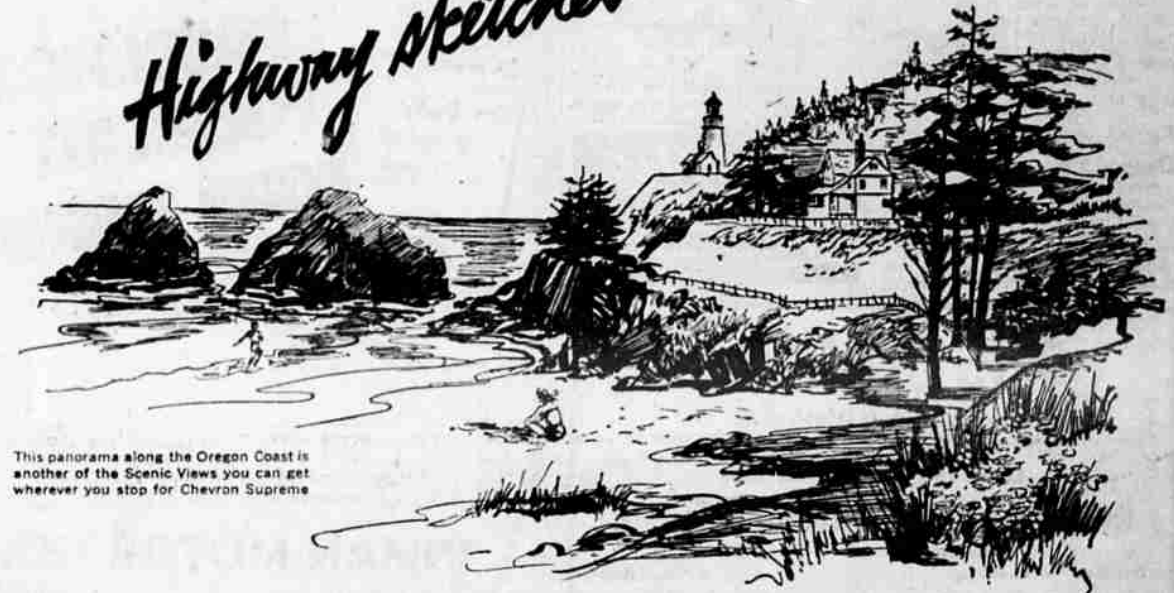

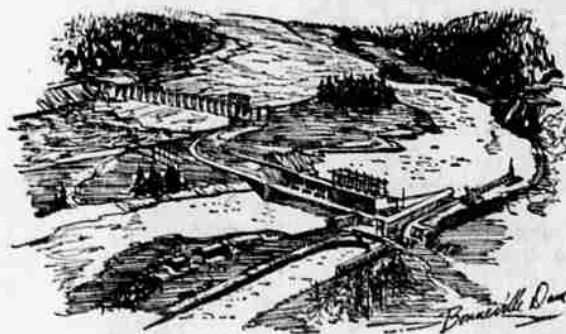
## Highway Sketches
