

# Solon Asks Probe Of Army Courts

WASHINGTON, July 8 (AP)—Senator Jenner (R-Ind.) contended today that "the high command in the European theater is stacking courts against defendants in courts martial."

In a letter to Secretary of War Patterson demanding a full investigation of army military trial procedure, Jenner offered what he said was documentary proof that:

1. "Prisoners are not being permitted to employ either civilian or military counsel of their own choice in the preparation and presentation of their defense."

2. "Every effort is being made to prevent attorneys who were connected with the infamous Lichfield prison case to practice in courts martial in the European theater."

The Indiana senator made public a copy of an informal "routing slip" which he said was signed by Brig. Gen. Cornelius E. Ryan, assistant deputy, military government headquarters for the military government for Germany, and written by Col. Francis H. Venderwerker. Jenner told newsmen that the routing slip substantiated his charges.

The slip, addressed to the chief of staff, USMGT (presumably U. S. forces, European theater), was dated last October 23.

It called attention to the impending arrival of Earl J. Carroll and Thomas Lester Foley, California attorneys, to act as special defense counsel for five prisoners then awaiting trial by general court martial at Frankfurt Am Main.

Jenner identified Carroll as counsel in the court martial of Col. James A. Killian in the Lichfield (England) prison brutality case.

## Todd-Pacific Shipyard Closes

SEATTLE, July 8 (AP)—Todd-Pacific shipyards, one of the city's largest wartime industries, is manned today by 33 watchmen and guards.

Closure of the war-born yard was announced yesterday by John D. Haynes, general manager of the parent company, Todd Drydocks, Inc. He said he did not know if the shutdown would be permanent.

Todd Drydocks also has cut its personnel from 2000 to 1700 and the Lake Union drydocks has released 80 of 340 personnel, officials said. Completion of conversion work was given as the reason.

## Two Fisheries Bills Okayed

WASHINGTON, July 8 (AP)—Two measures pertaining to Pacific Northwest fisheries were given house approval and transmitted yesterday to the senate.

One was the "sockeye salmon fishery act of 1947" which the house merchant marine committee said would carry out an agreement, signed by Canada in 1930 and ratified by both countries in 1937, authorizing endorsement of fishing regulations of the international Pacific salmon fisheries commission on the Fraser river system of British Columbia.

Also approved was the marine fisheries agreement drawn up by California, Oregon and Washington. Under this bill, regulation work of the three states will be coordinated with present activities of the federal fish and wildlife service.

## AP Announces Staff Shifts

NEW YORK, July 8 (AP)—Kent Cooper, executive director and general manager of the Associated Press, announced today that Paul Miller is resigning as assistant general manager, in charge of the Washington bureau, and will be succeeded by Helman Morin, with the title of acting chief of bureau.

Miller leaves to join The Gannett Newspapers. He will have headquarters at Rochester, N. Y., working in an executive capacity with Frank E. Gannett, founder and president.

Morin leaves the post of chief of bureau in Paris, with supervision over AP's continental news operations, to undertake his newly-assigned duties.

These administrative changes also were announced by Cooper. John Lloyd, now chief of bureau in London, to take over immediate supervision of the distribution of Associated Press news throughout Europe, his headquarters remaining in London.

Preston Grover, chief of bureau for India to succeed Morin as head of the Paris office, and G. Milton Kelly, now stationed in Bombay, to succeed Grover in charge of AP's India operations.

## Auto Dealer Held On Smuggling Count

SEATTLE, July 8 (AP)—H. F. Hawthorne, Seattle automobile dealer, was free today on \$1500 bail after being arrested yesterday by federal customs agents and charged with smuggling \$8000 worth of jade and diamonds from Shanghai, China, to Seattle.

Commissioner of Customs Howard MacGowan said Hawthorne was charged with smuggling in six diamonds ranging from 1.45 to 6 carats, five jade rings and two pieces of carved jade. One of the diamonds and all of the jade have been recovered, MacGowan said.

If your driver's license number is higher than 5R-66,000, get a renewal schedule from any service station, police or sheriff's office, or license clerk or examiner.
