

US National Leads State In Loans

The United States National bank in its report to the comptroller of the currency as of June 30, 1947, again leads the state in loans and discounts as well as in deposits, according to announcement by E. H. Thompson, manager of the Klamath Falls branch.

In its statement of condition, the bank reports loans and discounts amounting to a record-breaking \$113,214,591.74. This figure represents a gain of \$30,226,234.63 over the corresponding call date in 1946 and a gain of \$1,388,306.20 over the December 31, 1946 call.

The current statement shows total resources of \$546,423,408.06 and deposits of \$516,438,710.24.

"Oregon's business, industrial and agricultural interests are steadily climbing to new heights," Thompson said, "and we are proud that the United States National bank is able to assume an essential role in this development. The fact that the bank again leads the state in both deposits and loans and discounts is an important indication of the progress that is associated with the United States National bank and with the state of Oregon."

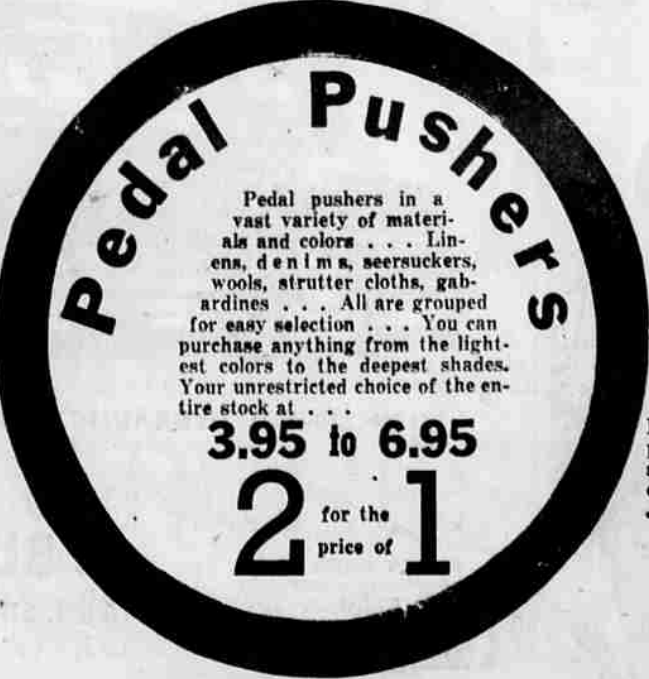
