

Legion Feed Slated For July 15th

A beef and a half has been earmarked for the annual feed of the Klamath Post No. 8 of the American Legion. The feed and installation meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday, July 15, 6:30 p. m. at Moore park and plans are being made to entertain between 500 and 600 guests.

Legion representatives from posts in Cave Junction, Grants Pass, Medford, Ashland, Central Point, the Rogue valley, Merrill, Malin and Lakeview will travel to Klamath Falls to attend the affair, and invitations have been extended to the Klamath public to join in the festivities.

Fritz Nissen, state department adjutant, will be the main speaker and will install the officers of Klamath Post No. 8. Commander for the coming year is Lynn Roycroft. Douglas Pence will serve as first vice commander, George Wood, second vice commander, Tom B. Young, adjutant and finance officer. New members of the executive committee include Fred Heilbronner, Bob Odell, Irene Young, Don Everett, Julian Abbott, and Jerry Thomas. Nissen will also install the new officers of the Merrill and Malin posts.

Sam Boves of Grants Pass, new district commander of District No. 4, and Art Kellert of Cave Junction, district vice commander, will also be present. Harry Pinkerton of Medford, past district vice commander, will present Jim Murray of the Klamath post with an award for securing 244 new members during the year.

The Legion feed has been an annual affair since 1931. The menu originally included steaks but with the war and the disappearance of choice cuts, crab, chicken, or barbecued beef have been served. General chairman for the dinner is Carl Schubert. Assisting him are Dr. M. E. Cooper, Les Finley, Paul Otterbein, Fred Heilbronner and Tom Youngs.
