TOKYO, July 9 (AP)—Emperor Hirohito has selected August 5, during the hottest part of the summer, for the start of his projected 11-day visit to the six northeastern prefectures of Japan. The emperor is making the trip

against the advice of his physicians in hopes of encouraging the farmers in view of the critical food shortage. He also will visit the Joban coal mines in Fukushima prefecture for the first time.
