

Art Exhibit Planned At Moore Park

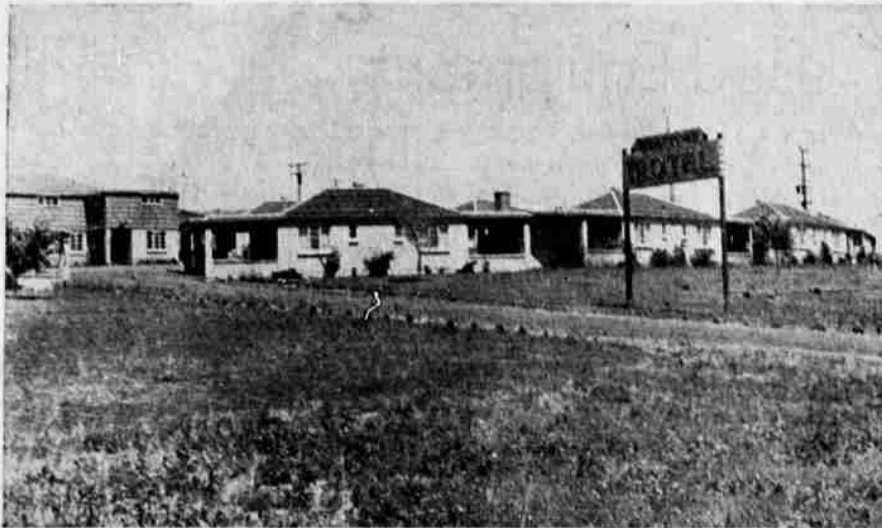
Tentative plans for an outdoor art exhibit to be held at Moore park sometime next month were discussed at a general meeting of the new Klamath Falls Art Association Tuesday night. Clayton Burrell, member of the board of directors, explained that plans for the project are not yet complete, but will be concluded at the next meeting slated for August 5, at the fine Grove office of Sheldon Brumbaugh, local architect. As spokesman for the organization, Burrell emphasized that everyone interested is invited to attend the meeting.

Membership plans were also discussed at Tuesday's meeting. As outlined, plans call for two groups of members. One group, to be known as patron members, will be granted inactive membership, and the other will be the active group.

Burrell said it is expected the association will become a popular rather than a select group, to the greater benefit of both art and artistic activity in the Klamath area. As an illustration of what he meant, Burrell pointed out he was by no means artistically inclined himself, but believed cultural activity one of the most worthwhile of all community betterment projects.

The association plans to organize a library committee in the near future to cooperate with library personnel in setting up a special art section in the city library. Also in the planning stage is the setting up of a junior art group under the sponsorship of the association. This organization will consist of young people of Klamath Falls who are

New Motel Opens On Weed-Ashland Highway Location

The latest thing in tourist convenience can be seen at Bratton's motel now operating on the outskirts of Klamath Falls near the Weed-Ashland junction. Final touches are being added to the 28 buildings which are owned and operated by Mr. and Mrs. W. T. Mann.

The natural beauty of the area has been incorporated in the buildings by using construction materials native to the Southern Oregon section. The motel, consisting of 32 units, is made of uncovered pumice brick. The interior is finished in natural pine. One of the outstanding features is the enlarged tinted photographs appearing in each unit. These picture Crater lake, Mt. Shasta, Lake of the Woods, and other scenic spots in this area.

All furniture in the rooms is made of either natural pine or leather. Included are Hollywood beds, writing tables, desks, and brightly upholstered chairs. Heat is furnished by wall heaters of electricity or gas. Grounds around the buildings are still being landscaped. Oregon grape, squaw carpet, and other shrubbery will be planted.

Work on the project was started in 1941 but because of restrictions set up by the war, the buildings could not be completed until this year. Plans for the motel were drawn by Mann, who has also built much of the furniture. Workmen include Clyde Dorrell, John Plymate, John Larson and Dale Hayden.

Four Drown In Washington

Four persons drowned in Western Washington waters yesterday, including an Enumclaw mother, who was swept into the surf at Long Beach attempting to aid her son, and a Richland doctor who went to her aid.

The victims were Mrs. Clarence La Fromboise, wife of the editor of the Enumclaw, Wash., Courier-Journal, and Dr. J. F. Taylor, 31, of Richland. The son, Richard, 14, whose appearance of trouble prompted the mother to enter the

water, made his way to safety. The coast guard recovered the body of the mother, but was unable to find that of the doctor. Both were with their families on vacation visits. The other mishaps occurred near Seattle. Clarence T. Aitt of Bellingham, an Alaska cannery tender, drowned when his outboard motorboat swamped in Lake Washington, and Ray Francis Getchman, 9, of Fall City drowned when swept from his feet while fishing in the Stouqualmie river near his home.
