History Of Congregation Sealed In Cornerstone

Laying of the cornerstone for the new Zion Lutheran church will take place Sunday morning at 11 a. m. 11th and High. The cornerstone, made of polished and engraved mahogany granite, has been presented to the Zion congregation by Mrs. M. Ward.

A metal storage box, to be placed behind the cornerstone, is being constructed and presented to the congregation by the Pade and Tittle sheet metal company.

Contained in the storage box will

be the constitution and history of the congregation, a list of the church officers and builders, a copy of the Sunday Bulletin, current church publications, a copy of The Herald and News, the names of the president, the governor, and the mayor and incidental papers.

Participating in the ceremony will be the Rev. Victor A. Schulze, the building committee and officers of the Zion congregation, Joe Robustelli, Herbert D. Johnson of Dunsmuir, and Howard Burkhard of Burkhard and Schortzen who are in charge of construction.

The concluding portions of the morning service will be held in the present church building. The Sunday school and Bible class meet at 9:45 a. m.

Families Fly

Gene Durant and Penny Payne flew into Lake o' the Woods Sunday afternoon in the Seabee and were later joined by Bob Nico-demus and Marge Hawkins in an Ercoupe, Audrey Redd and Stanley Bessie in an Aeronca and Andy Solani and family in an Ercoupe. Records Tests Made

After tests made on June 29 with the Seabee on Medicine lake, Calif., Penny Payne and Gene Durant, owners, claim a world record in gaining elevation at that altitude with a four-passenger load.

Motion and still pictures were taken of the tests as another passenger was added to the amphibian plane on each trip until a total of four weighing an average of 170 pounds each was accomplished.

Pictures and statements of those witnessing and making the tests have been sent to the Republic Seabee manufacturers to prove the authenticity of the world's record claim for the plane. Arthur Cher-

ry, a Klamath Falls pilot, was with them.

Medicine lake is two miles long and a mile wide, like a basin or crater surrounded by mountains and forests. The U. S. forest service surveys the altitude as 8800 feet above sea level.

Lake resort owner Nick Luttenich and L. J. Kalich, a business man from Watsonville, Calif., were among those witnessing the experiments. Further research will be made to determine the margin in this record over previous ones.

Wheat Crop Outlook Good

OTTAWA, July 11 (AP)—The numerical condition of spring wheat in Canada as of June 30, expressed as a percentage of the long-time average yield per acre, was 125 per cent, compared with 122 on the corresponding date last year, the dominion bureau of statistics reported.

The numerical condition of all wheat, including spring and fall, also was 125 while the condition figure for oats was 88, barley 91, all rye 87 and flaxseed 93.
