

Truman, GOP Leaders Agree That No Special Session Will Be Called

WASHINGTON, July 14 (AP)—Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.) said today President Truman and leaders of the republican congress have agreed that no special session of congress need be held this fall.

After a conference of the congressional "big six" with Mr. Truman, Vandenberg told reporters:

1. Mr. Truman gave his personal assurance he would not hold up his tax reduction bill veto message in order "not to interfere in any way with the adjournment schedule" of congress on July 26.

Strike In Pineapple Area Grows

HONOLULU, July 14 (AP)—The greater part of Hawaii's industry faced possible shutdown today as striking pineapple workers prepared to ask support from all territorial units of the CIO International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's union "in an effort to resist an employer lockout."

Robert McElrath, ILWU territorial representative, said "full and immediate support" of other units—sugar workers and longshoremen—would be sought at a meeting of the ILWU territorial committee today.

His statement followed a prediction by Federal Conciliator Nathan P. Feinsinger that the four-day pineapple strike "will sooner or later affect the sugar industry."

"The net result," he advised Secretary of Labor Schwelb, "will be to threaten substantially all major economic activities of the territory."

Feinsinger, who said he would leave for San Francisco today, told newsmen the ILWU and pineapple industry had almost reached agreement in their wage dispute, only to draw apart.

"This is the first time I've ever had a contract settled and then watched it blow up in my face," he added.

The struck pineapple firms alone represents a \$65,000,000-a-year business. The fruit still in the fields is estimated at \$40,000,000.

Jews Defy Army Dictum

JERUSALEM, July 14 (AP)—Irgun Zvai Leumi—Jewish underground organization—today defied the British army and police to free two British army sergeants whom it boasted of kidnapping and confining as hostages for three Irgunists under death sentence.

The Irgun announcement said the sergeants were unharmed and "in a place where they can be kept a month or more."

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Mrs. Gilreath Tells Story

WOOLDRIDGE, Tenn., July 14 (AP)—Mrs. Lucille Gilreath, young wife of the man charged in Grants Pass, Ore., with assault with intent to kill two-year-old Mary Jane Medlin, told a newspaper reporter here her husband had a "terrible temper."

"I don't see how he did a thing like that. He seemed to think a lot of children," the 23-year-old wife and mother told a reporter of the Knoxville, Tenn., Journal. She added, however, that "he did have a terrible temper."

Mrs. Gilreath said her husband left their home in Jellico, Tenn., January 14, 1946 to work in a sawmill in the town and "I hadn't heard or seen of him since, until I read in the paper about what he did in California."

Since their home in Jellico burned, killing her infant daughter, Yvonne, she has made her home with her father, Luther Anthony. A daughter, Barbara Joan, age four, lives with her.

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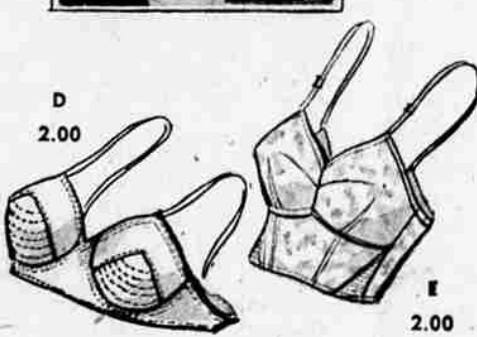
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
