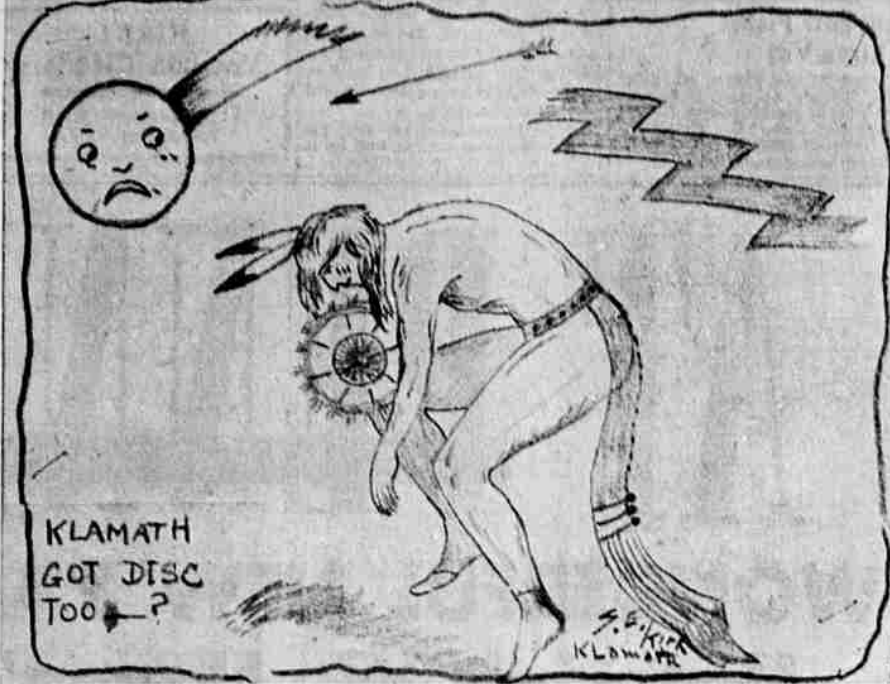

The circular object in the Indian's hand is a sort of tambourine, a round frame covered tightly with deer-hide, which was used to beat time to dances. The mournful object in the sky at left is Mr. Kirk's conception of one of the modern flying discs. He "doodled" the drawing at an Indian business committee meeting.
