

Yanks Moving Toward Mark Set In 1906

Bronx Bombers Have Won Sixteen In Row

One of the American league's most majestic marks—the 19 consecutive victories by the Chicago White Sox, famous hitless wonders of 1906—was being seriously threatened today by the New York Yankees.

The crushing Bronx Bombers now boast 16 straight wins and need only four more to shatter the record which has stood for the past 40 years.

The old Yankees of Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig and Tony Lazzeri back in 1906 reached 16 but were stopped the next day. The 1912 Washington Senators and 1931 Philadelphia Athletics went one better, winning 17 straight each, but got no further.

The major league record of 26 straight by the New York Giants of 1916 still is too far off to be given any serious thought.

In winning both ends of a twilight-night doubleheader from the Indians in Cleveland before a huge turnout of 62,355 paid fans yesterday, 8-4 and 2-1, the Yankees not only had the satisfaction of prolonging their streak but got their 16th win at the expense of the great Bob Feller.

After the Yanks had won the opener easily behind the 10-hit hurling of ex-Indian Alie Reynolds, the Indians went all out to halt the Yankees by leading with their strongest weapon—Feller. For eight innings the major's strikeout king held the New Yorkers and Pitcher Floyd (Bill) Bevens even, 1-1. But in the ninth, Joe DiMaggio reached base and with two out carried the all-important run over the plate when Billy Johnson rammed a triple.

Another consecutive win streak, perhaps more remarkable if not as spectacular as the Yankees' skid, belongs to Ewell Blackwell, Cincinnati's sensational stringbean right-hander. Blackwell pitched his 14th straight victory last night as the Reds hit the .500 mark with a 5-4 win over the Phillies in Philadelphia. Al Jurisich was the loser.

Pittsburgh's last place Pirates handed National league leader Brooklyn a double setback, 12-4 and 3-3, in their twin bill at Ebbets field. Led by Rookie Outfielder Wally Westlake, who drove in seven runs with a base-clearing double and grand slam homer, the Braves walloped four Dodgers hurlers for 16 hits in the opener.

With Dave Koslo pitching five-hit ball, the Giants shut out the Chicago Cubs at the Polo Grounds 4-0 to move within three and a half games of the lead and only one game behind the second place Boston Braves.

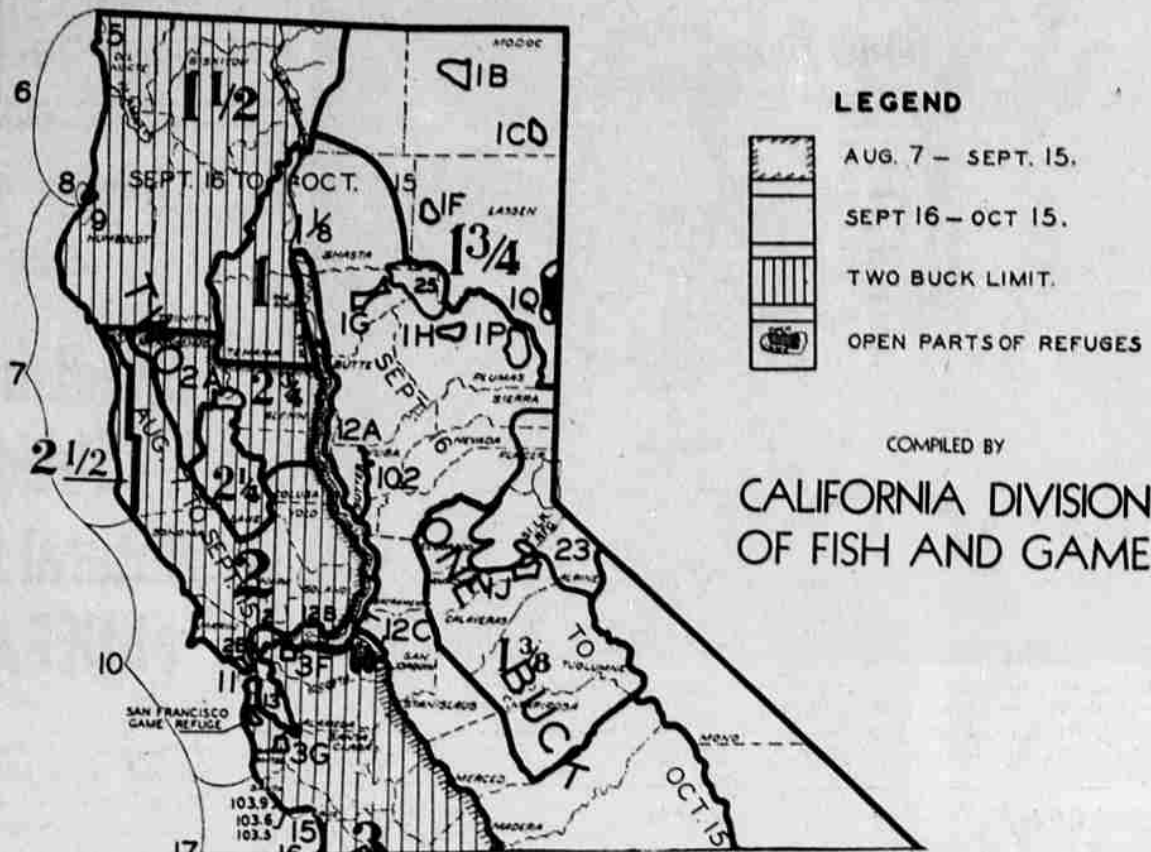
Scoring four runs in each of the sixth and eighth innings after being held hitless for five frames by Rookie Wali Lanfranconi, the St. Louis Cardinals whipped the Braves 6-2 in Boston, placing them in the small-place position, four and a half games behind the Brooks.

The Tigers, playing to their smallest twilight game crowd of the season—11,378 paid fans—scored four runs in the sixth inning to overcome a 5-4 Washington lead and went on to win, 11-6.

Scoring four runs in the seventh inning, the Chicago White Sox redoubled Tex Hughson and the Boston Red Sox 5-1 in Chicago to move past Washington into sixth place.

Although he lost his shutout in the ninth inning when Vern Stephens tripled and scored on Jeff Heath's infield out, Phil Marchiondi gained his 10th victory when he pitched the Philadelphia Athletics to an 8-1 triumph over the Browns in St. Louis.

Jackson Landed For Bout

Emery Jackson, San Francisco colored boxing veteran, has been signed to a return match with Jack (Ginger) Snapp, the fight to be held in the Klamath Falls armory next Tuesday night, July 22.

Jackson is one of two men who have defeated the Merrill Marauder in the past year and a half, turning the trick at Portland July 1 by way of a 10-round referee's decision.

The fight will be a 10-round, middleweight division, at the top of the July 22 local fight card and promises to be probably the best fistful duel staged here since pre-war days. In the Portland fight Jackson showed that he was the best man Snapp ever met and the ring wisdom he gained over some 135 pro battles was what beat the local puncher.

Reserve seat tickets for the bout went on sale this morning at Matt Finnigan's sporting goods store. Promoter Mack Lillard said he had had considerable trouble, mostly financial, in getting Jackson for the fight, but that last night at least four people who are interested in the boy came to terms. Jackson has personally been willing to fight again ever since his first meeting with Ginger.

Last night at Seattle Snapp fought and won a 10-round main event against Milo Savage of Seattle. He won on a decision.

Snapp disdained the punching prowess of Savage, considered the No. 2 middleweight in the Northwest, to upset the favored Seattle boy. Ginger weighed 160 to Savage's 157, and almost finished the fight in the fifth heat when he staggered Milo three times with right crosses.

Hot Rod Runs On Slate For County Oval

Drivers Attracted From Four States

About 25 hot rod drivers and their souped-up cars will be in town Sunday for a series of races around the dirt oval at the county fairgrounds. The drivers will be drawn from Oregon, Washington, California and Nevada and the races will be under the authorization of the state racing association.

Including the time trials, which are slated to start at 1 p.m., about four hours of speeding is on the docket for the fairgrounds oval, the first races of the type ever held in Klamath Falls.

The drivers were in Portland last Sunday and will race in Salem Thursday. Les Anderson, who finished just out of the money in the Indianapolis speedway classic, is one of the hot rod skippers expected to enter the local running.

The cars used are all stock roadsters, but the drivers have ripped out the factory engines and installed supercharged engines capable of powering the vehicles around a track like the one at the fairgrounds at better than 100 miles an hour. The hot-rod record is 141-plus miles an hour, set on a straightaway over the Utah salt flats.

No restrictions are placed on the motors, but the chassis of the jalopies can take up no more ground space than as when it was originally built.

The speedsters will run time trials, five-heat races, a three-lap "helmet dash" around the 1/2-mile oval, and two main event or payoff races.

ALL-TIME INDOOR GATE EXPECTED AT CHICAGO

CHICAGO, July 16 (AP)—Tony Zale, world's middleweight champion, and Challenger Rocky Graziano, two of the greatest offensive fighters in the past 10 years, battle tonight before upwards of 20,000 spectators who will contribute to a record all-time indoor gate of around \$450,000.

The contest in the Chicago stadium is scheduled for 15 rounds or less—undoubtedly less, considering the punching prowess of both. No one, including Zale and Graziano, believes it will go the limit. The consensus of experts is that Zale will triumph within six rounds.

Zale at the age of 33 defends his title for the second time against the challenger of Graziano, 25. The two will be an encore of the knockdown-and-count-Rocky-out thriller fought in New York last September in which Zale dragged himself off the canvas to win by a knockout in six savage rounds.

This rematch was scheduled for New York last spring but the New York athletic commission revoked Graziano's license for failure to report an unsuccessful attempt by gamblers to bribe him with the result that the bout was switched to Chicago.

Zale remained a steadfast 7 to 9 betting favorite.

Three Scraps Follow Royal

All bouts after the battle royal for the Friday night inaugural mat card will be of four 10-minute rounds duration. The mass scrap will go until four of the six contestants have been downed.

The matches will be held at the armory on Friday nights from now on, following a layoff of three weeks and a switch from the Thursday date.

Pete Belcastro, Tex Hater, Jack Kiser, Australian Jack Carter, Buck Davidson and Stocky Knellson are the fighters lined up to start things going again. They will tangle in a battle royal to determine pairings for the three bouts afterwards.

First two men downed retire to the dressing room and return later for the opening duel, second pair gone have the semi-windup, and the two remaining have the main event.
