A legal paper charging burglary was read to Grady Mayfield, 25, in a Klamath Valley hospital room yesterday afternoon and the California ex-seaman who is under arrest although confined to bed told officers he would not waive extradition to California. Bail was set at \$2500.

Mayfield suffered a broken ankle and severely bruised heels several days ago when he plunged through a skylight to the tile floor of a barber shop on Klamath avenue. He told police he had gone to the top of the building to find a place to sleep.

The local charge accuses Mayfield of being in the building with intent to burglarize, and California authorities want him for parole violation. He has been in San Quentin for burglary.

Mayfield has been living in Chillicothe, and officers there found a set of burglar's tools in his room. He is under guard at the hospital.
