

# Southern Pacific Railroad Faces Threat Of Strike By Brotherhood Of Engineers

Threat of a strike by the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, set for Monday at 6 p. m., hangs over the Southern Pacific railroad today, and all SP freight and passenger service on the West coast, including the trains through Klamath Falls, will come to a standstill at that time unless the union and railroad management come to terms over the week-end.

Southern Pacific engineers here a month ago received their instructions as to what to do in the event of a work shutdown. The strike was authorized by the engineers in a vote last January, but was not called until last night.

The local instructions are for engineers not to take any trains out of a division point after 6 p. m. Monday. A train on a run at the 6 o'clock deadline will proceed to the nearest point where the railroad has facilities for caring for the trains.

That means that if the strike comes off, trains will be halted here, in Eugene and Dunsmuir on this SP branch.

## Arms Bill Gets Okay

WASHINGTON, July 17 (AP)—The house foreign affairs committee today approved legislation calling for arms standardization and military cooperation between the countries of the western hemisphere.

The committee action limited the United States expenditure to \$50,000,000 for a five-year program.

Changes of the bill's passage at this session of congress appear slight in view of the drive for adjournment by the end of next week. The measure thus will probably lie over for action early next year.

Before stamping its approval on the bill, the committee wrote in an amendment to provide that execution of the program must be consistent with the United States "good neighbor" program.

## Magnuson Backs Seattle Site

SEATTLE, July 17 (AP)—Senator Magnuson, D-Wash., said today he had queried the state department on the possibilities of holding the Japanese peace treaty conference in Seattle.

The query was made, he said, after learning of apparent disagreement among the victor nations as to a site for the meeting. Senator Cain made a similar request earlier in the week.

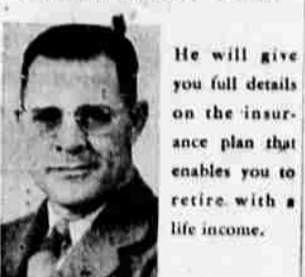
